If the court finds a violation of subdivision (2), the court
 shall void the commutation at issue and enjoin the Governor
 from granting the inmate a commutation or reprieve until the
 Governor takes reasonable steps to provide the notice required
 by that subdivision.

6 "<u>(b)</u> The legislature shall have power to Legislature 7 <u>may</u> provide for and to regulate the administration of pardons, 8 paroles, remission of fines, and forfeitures, and may 9 authorize the courts having criminal jurisdiction to suspend <u>a</u> 10 sentence and to order probation.

11 "(c) No pardon shall relieve from civil and 12 political disabilities unless specifically expressed in the 13 pardon."

15 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 16 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the 17 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 18 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 19 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 20 state.
