8	To amend Section 16-28-3, Code of Alabama 1975,
9	relating to school attendance; to require any child who
10	withdraws from a public school to enroll in and attend an
11	accredited online school to be counted as a transfer student;
12	and to require grade placement testing for any student who
13	later returns to a public school.
14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
15	Section 1. This bill does not and should not be
16	interpreted to create on-line schools. However, if a student
17	chooses to attend an accredited, state authorized on-line
18	school, that student's former school should not be penalized
19	by the student being classified as a dropout.
20	Section 2. Section 16-28-3, Code of Alabama 1975, is
21	amended to read as follows:
22	"§16-28-3.
23	"Every (a) Except as otherwise provided in
24	subsection (b), every child between the ages of six and 17
25	years shall be required to attend a public school, private
26	school, church school, or be instructed by a competent private
27	tutor for the entire length of the school term in every

scholastic year except that, prior to attaining his or her 16th birthday every child attending a church school as defined in Section 16-28-1 is exempt from the requirements of this section, provided such child complies with enrollment and reporting procedure specified in Section 16-28-7. Admission to public school shall be on an individual basis on the application of the parents, legal custodian, or guardian of the child to the local board of education at the beginning of each school year, under such rules and regulations as the board may prescribe. The parent, legal custodian, or guardian of a child who is six years of age, may opt out of enrolling their child in school at the age of six years by notifying the local school board of education, in writing, that the child will not be enrolled in school until he or she is seven years of age.

"(b) If a child withdraws from a public school, upon verification of enrollment in an a Southern Association of Colleges and Schools or any entity with accreditation status as determined by one of the agencies identified on the United States Department of Education's list of Recognized National and Regional Accrediting Agencies or their affiliates accredited and recognized online school which has been authorized by the Alabama State Department of Education to provide instruction in lieu of in-person instruction, the child shall be counted as a transfer student.

5	first day of the third month following its passage and
6	approval by the Covernor or its otherwise becoming law
