5 A BILL  
6 TO BE ENTITLED  
7 AN ACT

8 To amend Section 20-2-25, Code of Alabama 1975,  
9 relating to Schedule II of the controlled substances list, to  
10 include additional controlled substances; and in connection  
11 therewith would have as its purpose of effect the requirement  
12 of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the  
13 meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of  
14 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official  
15 Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as  
16 amended.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

18 Section 1. Section 20-2-25, Code of Alabama 1975, is  
19 amended to read as follows:

20 "§20-2-25.

21 "The controlled substances listed in this section  
22 are included in Schedule II:

23 "(1) Any of the following substances, except those  
24 narcotic drugs listed in other schedules, whether produced  
25 directly or indirectly by extraction from substances of  
26 vegetable origin or independently by means of chemical

1 synthesis or by combination of extraction and chemical  
2 synthesis:

3 "a. Opium and opiate and any salt, compound,  
4 derivative, or preparation of opium or opiate.

5 "b. Any salt, compound, isomer, derivative, or  
6 preparation thereof which is chemically equivalent or  
7 identical with any of the substances referred to in paragraph  
8 a, but not including the isoquinoline alkaloids of opium.

9 "c. Opium poppy and poppy straw.

10 "d. Coca leaves and any salt, compound, derivative,  
11 or preparation of coca leaves and any salt, compound,  
12 derivative, or preparation thereof which is chemically  
13 equivalent or identical with any of these substances, but not  
14 including decocainized coca leaves or extractions which do not  
15 contain cocaine or ecgonine.

16 "e. Tianeptine and any salt, sulfate, free acid, or  
17 other preparation of Tianeptine, and any salt, sulfate, free  
18 acid, compound, derivative, precursor, or preparation thereof  
19 which is ~~substantially~~ chemically equivalent or identical with  
20 Tianeptine."

21 "(2) Any of the following opiates, including their  
22 isomers, esters, ethers, salts, and salts of isomers, whenever  
23 the existence of these isomers, esters, ethers, and salts is  
24 possible within the specific chemical designation:

25 "a. Alphaprodine;

26 "b. Anileridine;

27 "c. Bezitramide;

- 1 "d. Dihydrocodeine;
- 2 "e. Diphenoxylate;
- 3 "f. Fentanyl;
- 4 "g. Isomethadone;
- 5 "h. Levomethorphan;
- 6 "i. Levorphanol;
- 7 "j. Metazocine;
- 8 "k. Methadone;
- 9 "m. Moramide - Intermediate,
- 10 2-methyl-3-morpholino-1, 1-diphenyl-propane-carboxylic acid;
- 11 "n. Pethidine;
- 12 "o. Pethidine - Intermediate-A,
- 13 4-cyano-1-methyl-4-phenylpiperidine;
- 14 "p. Pethidine - Intermediate-B,
- 15 ethyl-4-phenylpiperidine-4-carboxylate;
- 16 "q. Pethidine - Intermediate-C,
- 17 1-methyl-4-phenylpiperidine-4-carboxylic acid;
- 18 "r. Phenazocine;
- 19 "s. Piminodine;
- 20 "t. Racemethorphan;
- 21 "u. Racemorphan."

22 Section 2. Although this bill would have as its  
23 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased  
24 expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further  
25 requirements and application under Amendment 621, now  
26 appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of  
27 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the

1 bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an  
2 existing crime.

3 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the  
4 first day of the ~~third~~first month following its passage and  
5 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
