SYNOPSIS: Under current law, citizens or the county or 8 municipal board of education may under certain 9 10 circumstances request that the county commission 11 call an election to determine whether to levy a 12 special tax for school purposes. The county 13 commission is required to call the election and where a special election is called, the county 14 15 commission pays all costs of the election.

16 This bill would require citizens or the 17 county or municipal school board to follow certain 18 procedures for requesting an election to determine 19 whether the county shall levy a special tax, 20 including time frames for requesting that the 21 election be held in conjunction with a primary or general election or that a special election be 22 23 held. This bill would also require the school board 24 to pay all costs associated with a special 25 election.

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4	To amend Sections 16-13-160 to 16-13-162, inclusive,
5	16-13-164, 16-13-180, 16-13-183 to 16-13-185, inclusive, Code
6	of Alabama 1975, and to repeal Sections 16-13-181 and
7	16-13-186, Code of Alabama 1975, relating to special school
8	tax elections; to require the citizens or county or municipal
9	board of education requesting that the county commission call
10	a special school tax election to follow certain procedures
11	including time frames for requesting the election be held in
12	conjunction with a primary or general election or that a
13	special election be held; and to require the school board to
14	pay any additional costs for holding the school tax election
15	at the primary or general election and to pay all costs
16	associated with a special election.
17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. Sections 16-13-160, 16-13-161, 16-13-162,
19	16-13-164, 16-13-180, 16-13-183, 16-13-184, and 16-13-185,
20	Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
21	"§16-13-160.
22	" <u>(a)</u> Upon <u>receipt of</u> a petition <u>that is</u> signed by
23	200 or more qualified electors of the county who are also
24	freeholders, to and requests an election for a special tax,
25	the county commission in any county within the State of
26	Alabama, the said commission shall order an election to
27	determine whether or not a special tax of one mill shall be

1 levied for the support of the public schools within said the 2 county as hereinafter provided. If the petition is received at least 45 days before a primary or general election, the county 3 4 commission shall order the election to be held in conjunction with the scheduled primary or general election. No election 5 shall be set on the date of a runoff election unless the 6 7 school board agrees to be responsible for all expenditures associated with the election in the event there are no other 8 state or local issues on the ballot. 9 10 "(b) Petitioners may request that the county commission call a special election if the petitioners submit 11 12 with their petition, a resolution adopted by the county board of education wherein the county board of education agrees to 13 14 be responsible for all costs associated with the election 15 within 30 days of receipt of an invoice from the county commission. The school board may request a date for the 16 17 election provided, however, that: "(1) a special election may not be set for a date 18 less than 90 days from the resolution calling the election; 19 "(2) no special election may be set on a date during 20 21 the period that begins 45 days before a primary election and 22 continues through a date 45 days after the following general 23 election; and 24 "(3) if the county commission determines that the 25 date requested by the school board will work an undue 26 administrative or financial burden on the offices conducting 27 the election, it may set the election for an alternative date

as close as possible to the date requested by the school
 board.

"(c) Except under extraordinary circumstances 3 recorded in the minutes of the county commission meeting, the 4 county commission shall set the election date within 30 days 5 of receipt of the request for same. If the decision on setting 6 7 the election is delayed, the county commission shall set the election at its next regular or special meeting. The county 8 commission shall adopt a resolution setting the date for 9 10 election, which resolution shall immediately be delivered to 11 the probate judge.

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"§16-13-161.

13 "There shall be made publication of the election in 14 some newspaper within the county, which publication shall show 15 Except as otherwise specifically provided in this article, any election held pursuant to this article shall be conducted 16 under the general laws of the state. The notice of election 17 18 shall include the rate of such proposed tax, the time it is proposed to be continued and the purpose for which the levy is 19 20 proposed to be made.

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"§16-13-162.

"(a) The inspectors and election officers of the
election shall be appointed and such elections the election
shall be held and the result of said elections shall be
declared in the same manner and by the same officers as is the
result of the regular general elections for county officers
under the general laws of the state.

1 "(b) The If the election provided for in this 2 article may be had is held at the time of holding any regular a primary, runoff, or general election within the county; and, 3 4 if held at any such time, the inspectors and officers of the general election shall conduct at the same time the election 5 6 herein provided for; and for such services they shall receive 7 no compensation other than that allowed them for the holding of the primary, runoff, or general election; but if such an a 8 special election is had at any other time than that of holding 9 10 a regular election within the county, then held, the election officers shall receive the same pay as that for holding a 11 12 primary, runoff, or general election.

If a special election is held 18 as authorized in Section 16-13-160, the county board of 19 education shall reimburse the county for all expenditures 20 associated with the special election within 30 days of receipt 21 22 of an invoice from the county commission. "(a) The inspectors and election officers of the 18 19 special county election shall be appointed and said the election shall be held and the results of such the election 20 21 shall be declared in the same manner and by the same officers 22 as the results of the regular a general election for county 23 officers, under the general election laws of the state; 24 provided, that. If the election may be is held at the time for holding any regular a primary, runoff, or general election in 25 26 the county; and, if held at such time, the inspectors and election officers of the primary or general election shall 27

1 conduct at the same time the election herein provided for and 2 for such services they shall receive no compensation other 3 than that allowed them for the holding of the general 4 election. If the <u>a special</u> election is held, at some other 5 time than that of holding the regular election in the county, 6 then the election officers shall receive the same pay as that 7 for holding the <u>primary, runoff, or</u> general election.

"(b) The managers and returning officers, provided 8 for above, shall conduct and make return of such election in 9 the rural or city school tax district; and, in the event such 10 election officers fail to appear at the polling place to which 11 12 they are appointed, the officer or officers who do appear 13 shall appoint someone to take their places. All election 14 officers shall be residents of the special school tax district 15 and qualified electors of the beat or precinct in which they reside. The sheriff shall notify all officers of their 16 17 appointment by the county commission. The managers of such election shall open and close the polls pursuant to Section 18 17-7-5.1 on the date of election and, immediately upon closing 19 20 the polls, shall ascertain the results of the election at 21 their respective voting places, and make returns of the same 22 to the county commission and deliver the ballot box containing 23 the returns, with the poll lists, tally sheets and other 24 necessary papers, to the returning officers of such voting 25 places, who shall deliver the same to the county commission on or before noon of the second day of the said election. The 26 27 county commission shall, within four days after said election, 1 canvass the returns so made and under oath make a written 2 report declaring the result of said election in said school tax district, showing the number of votes cast, both for and 3 4 against the proposed taxation. A copy of such report shall be 5 printed in some newspaper published in the county, and the original shall be filed in the office of the probate judge. 6 7 Except as otherwise specifically provided herein, said in this article, any election held pursuant to this article shall be 8 held conducted under the general laws of the state. 9

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"§16-13-185.

"The election officers, including the sheriff, shall 11 12 perform the same duties and receive the same pay as provided 13 for under the general election laws aforesaid, and all costs 14 and fees of said election shall be paid out of the county 15 treasury. of the state. If the election is held in conjunction with a primary, runoff, or general election, the county shall 16 17 be reimbursed by the state for election expenses as authorized and provided in Chapter 21 of Title 17 and by the county or 18 municipal board of education for any additional expenses 19 incurred for conducting the election on the special tax. If a 20 21 special election is held as authorized in this article, the 22 county or municipal board of education which requested the 23 special election shall reimburse the county for all 24 expenditures associated with the special election within 30 25 days of receipt of an invoice from the county commission. The 26 county or municipal board of education is authorized to expend

1	any available revenues under its control for reimbursing costs
2	due to the county commission as provided herein."
3	Section 2. Section 16-13-181 and Section 16-13-186,
4	Code of Alabama 1975, are repealed.
5	Section 3. This act shall become effective
6	immediately following its passage and approval by the

7 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
