8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, the rules of the road
9 specify that vehicles traveling at less than the
10 normal speed of traffic are to travel in the
11 right-hand lane or as close to the right-hand curb
12 or edge of the roadway as practicable. Under
13 existing law, a violation of any of the rules of
14 the road is a misdemeanor unless otherwise

specified.

This bill would prohibit a vehicle traveling on the interstate highway from remaining in the leftmost lane for more than 1.5 miles without completely passing another vehicle, with exceptions.

Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901 prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved

by the affected entity; or the Legislature

appropriates funds, or provides a local source of

revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in Amendment 621.

## A BILL

## TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2.0

Relating to motor vehicles and traffic; to amend Section 32-5A-80 of Code of Alabama 1975, to require a vehicle traveling on an interstate highway to travel in the right lane unless passing another vehicle; to provide exceptions; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901..

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This act shall be known as the Anti-Road Rage Act.

Section 2. Section 32-5A-80 of the Code of Alabama 2 1975, is amended to read as follows:

3 "\$32-5A-80.

- "(a) Upon all roadways of sufficient width, a vehicle shall be driven upon the right half of the roadway, except as follows under any of the following conditions:
- "(1) When overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction under the rules governing such movement.
  - "(2) When an obstruction exists making it necessary to drive to the left of the center of the highway; provided, any person doing so shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles traveling in the proper direction upon the unobstructed portion of the highway within such distance as to constitute an immediate hazard.
  - "(3) Upon a roadway divided into three marked lanes for traffic under the rules applicable thereon; or.
    - "(4) Upon a roadway restricted to one-way traffic.
  - "(b) Upon all roadways, any vehicle proceeding at less than the normal speed of traffic at the time and place and under the conditions then existing shall be driven in the right-hand lane then available for traffic, or as close as practicable to the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway, except when overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction or when preparing for a left turn at an intersection or into a private road or driveway.

1	"(c) Upon any roadway having four or more lanes for
2	moving traffic and providing for two-way movement of traffic,
3	no vehicle shall be driven to the left of the center line of
4	the roadway, except when authorized by official
5	traffic-control devices designating certain lanes to the left
6	side of the center of the roadway for use by traffic not
7	otherwise permitted to use such lanes, or except as permitted
8	under subsection (a)(2). However, this subsection shall not be
9	construed as prohibiting the crossing of the center line in
10	making a left turn into or from an alley, private road, or
11	driveway.
12	"(d)(1) Upon any interstate highway, except as
13	provided in subdivision (2), a vehicle may not remain in the
14	<u>leftmost lane for more than 1.5 miles without completely</u>
15	passing another vehicle.
16	"(2) A vehicle may travel in the leftmost lane under
17	any of the following conditions:
18	"a. When traffic conditions or congestion make it
19	necessary to operate a vehicle in the leftmost lane.
20	"b. When inclement weather, obstructions, or hazards
21	make it necessary to operate a vehicle in the leftmost lane.
22	"c. When compliance with a law, rule, ordinance, or
23	traffic control device makes it necessary to operate a vehicle
24	in the leftmost lane.
25	"d. When exiting a roadway to the left.
26	"e. When paying a toll or user fee at a toll
27	collection facility

1	"f. If the vehicle is an authorized emergency
2	vehicle operated in the course of duty.
3	"g. If the vehicle is operated or used in the course
4	of highway maintenance or construction."
5	Section 3. For 60 days following the effective date
6	of this act, a law enforcement officer may issue only a
7	warning citation for a violation of subsection (d) of Section
8	32-5A-80, Code of Alabama 1975.
9	Section 4. Although this bill would have as its
10	purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased
11	expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further
12	requirements and application under Amendment 621 because the
13	bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an
14	existing crime.
15	Section 5. This act shall become effective on the
16	first day of the third month following its passage and
17	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
