ENROLLED, An Act,

Relating to Mobile County; to provide for contracting of police services by a municipality with the Sheriff of Mobile County; and to provide for compensation and distribution.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This act shall apply only to Mobile County.

Section 2. Any municipality within Mobile County may contract for police services with the sheriff of the county. The contract may include the enforcement by the sheriff and his or her duly commissioned deputies of all laws within the corporate limits and police jurisdiction of the municipality including municipal ordinances and the arrest or citation of any offenders as if the sheriff and his or her deputies were duly constituted police officers of the municipality.

Section 3. A municipality entering into a contract with the sheriff for police services shall pay to the county treasury a sum sufficient to provide the necessary manpower and equipment as mutually agreed upon by the municipal governing body, the sheriff of the county, and the county commission.

Section 4. The county governing body may receive money from the municipality for police services and may expend

1 the funds for police services in the contracting municipality,  
2 including the police jurisdiction of the municipality.

3 Section 5. Each contract between the county  
4 governing body and the contracting municipality shall be with  
5 the consent and approval of the sheriff and the county  
6 commission.

7 Section 6. The sheriff and his or her duly  
8 commissioned deputies shall retain the legal and  
9 constitutional immunity afforded to each of them by law.

10 Section 7. All laws or parts of laws which conflict  
11 with this act are repealed.

12 Section 8. This act shall become effective  
13 immediately following its passage and approval by the  
14 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
