3 Relating to first responders; to add Section 32-5A-2.1
4 to the Code of Alabama 1975, to provide a definition of
5 pedestrian; and to amend Sections 32-5A-213, 32-5A-218, and
6 32-1-1.1, Code of Alabama 1975, to provide for the duty of a
7 driver to exercise due care to avoid a first responder; and to
8 require the driver of a vehicle to yield the right-of-way to a
9 first responder on a sidewalk.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

11 Section 1. Section 32-5A-2.1 is added to Chapter 5A to
12 read as follows:

13 §32-5A-2.1

14 (a) For purposes of this chapter, "pedestrian" means
15 any individual afoot, except as provided in subsection (b).

16 (b) For purposes of this chapter, "pedestrian" does not
17 include a first responder performing a public safety function
18 that the first responder is authorized to perform and that is
19 in the line and scope of his or her employment or volunteer
20 service, including, but not limited to, any of the following:

21 (1) Directing, controlling, or regulating the flow of
22 traffic.

23 (2) Responding to a fire, a collision site, an
24 emergency call, or a fire alarm.

25 (3) Rendering first aid or emergency medical care.

26 (4) Responding to an imminent threat of bodily injury
27 to self or others.

28 (5) Pursuing or apprehending an actual or suspected



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29 violator of the law.

30 (6) Moving a vehicle standing upon a street or highway.

31 (7) Entering or remaining on a street or highway for
32 any other law enforcement purpose.

33 Section 2. Sections 32-5A-213, 32-5A-218, and 32-1-1.1,
34 Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

35 "§32-5A-213

36 ~~Notwithstanding other provisions of this chapter or the~~
37 ~~provisions of any local ordinance~~ any provision of law to the
38 contrary, every driver of a vehicle shall exercise due care to
39 avoid colliding with any pedestrian or first responder and
40 shall give warning by sounding the horn when necessary and
41 shall exercise proper precaution upon observing any child or
42 any obviously confused, incapacitated, or intoxicated person."

43 "§32-5A-218

44 The driver of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to
45 any pedestrian or first responder on a sidewalk."

46 "§32-1-1.1

47 The following words and phrases when used in this title
48 shall have the following meanings ~~respectively ascribed to~~
49 ~~them in this section~~, except when the context otherwise
50 requires:

51 (1) ALLEY. A street or highway intended to provide
52 access to the rear or side of lots or buildings in urban
53 districts and not intended for the purpose of through
54 vehicular traffic.

55 (2) ARTERIAL STREET. Any federal or state numbered
56 route, controlled-access highway, or other major radial or



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57 circumferential street or highway designated by local
58 authorities within their respective jurisdictions as part of a
59 major arterial system of streets or highways.

60 (3) AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY VEHICLE. Such fire department
61 vehicles, police vehicles, and ambulances as are publicly
62 owned, and such other publicly or privately owned vehicles as
63 are designated by the Secretary of the Alabama State Law
64 Enforcement Agency or the chief of police of an incorporated
65 city.

66 (4) BICYCLE. Every device propelled by human power upon
67 which any individual may ride, having two tandem wheels either
68 of which is more than 14 inches in diameter.

69 (5) BUS. Every motor vehicle designed for carrying more
70 than 10 passengers and used for the transportation of
71 individuals and every motor vehicle other than a taxicab,
72 designed and used for the transportation of individuals for
73 compensation.

74 (6) BUSINESS DISTRICT. The territory contiguous to and
75 including a highway when within any 600 feet along the highway
76 there are buildings in use for business or industrial
77 purposes, including, but not limited to, hotels, banks, office
78 buildings, railroad stations, and public buildings which
79 occupy at least 300 feet of frontage on one side or 300 feet
80 collectively on both sides of the highway.

81 (7) CANCELLATION OF ~~DRIVER'S~~DRIVER LICENSE. The
82 annulment or termination by formal action of the Secretary of
83 the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency of an individual's
84 ~~driver's~~driver license because of some error or defect in the



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85 license or because the licensee is no longer entitled to the
86 license, but the cancellation of a license is without
87 prejudice and application for a new license may be made at any
88 time after such cancellation.

89 (8) CONTROLLED-ACCESS HIGHWAY. Every highway, street,
90 or roadway in respect to which owners or occupants of abutting
91 lands and other persons have no legal right of access to or
92 from the same except at such points only and in such manner as
93 may be determined by the public authority having jurisdiction
94 over the highway, street, or roadway.

95 (9) CROSSWALK. Either of the following:

96 a. That part of a roadway at an intersection included
97 within the connections of the lateral lines of the sidewalks
98 on opposite sides of the highway measured from the curbs or,
99 in the absence of curbs, from the edges of the traversable
100 roadway.

101 b. Any portion of a roadway at an intersection or
102 elsewhere distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by
103 lines or other markings on the surface.

104 (10) DEALER. Every person engaged in the business of
105 buying, selling, or exchanging vehicles who has an established
106 place of business for that purpose in this state and to whom
107 current dealer registration plates have been issued by the
108 Department of Revenue.

109 (11) DEPARTMENT. The Alabama State Law Enforcement
110 Agency acting directly or through its duly authorized officers
111 and agents.

112 (12) DIRECTOR. The Secretary of the Alabama State Law



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113 Enforcement Agency.

114 (13) DRIVEAWAY-TOWAWAY OPERATION. Any operation in
115 which any motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer, singly or in
116 combination, new or used, constitutes the commodity being
117 transported, when one set or more of wheels of any such
118 vehicle are on the roadway during the course of
119 transportation, whether or not any such vehicle furnishes the
120 motive power.

121 (14) DRIVER. Every individual who drives or is in
122 actual physical control of a vehicle.

123 (15) ~~DRIVER'S~~DRIVER LICENSE. Any license to operate a
124 motor vehicle issued under the laws of this state.

125 (16) ELECTRIC BICYCLE. A bicycle equipped with fully
126 operable pedals, a saddle or seat for the rider, and an
127 electric motor of less than 750 watts that meets the
128 requirements of one of the following three classes:

129 a. Class 1 electric bicycle means an electric bicycle
130 equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the
131 rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when
132 the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour.

133 b. Class 2 electric bicycle means an electric bicycle
134 equipped with a motor that may be used exclusively to propel
135 the bicycle and that is not capable of providing assistance
136 when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour.

137 c. Class 3 electric bicycle means an electric bicycle
138 equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the
139 rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when
140 the bicycle reaches the speed of 28 miles per hour.



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141 (17) ELECTRIC PERSONAL ASSISTIVE MOBILITY DEVICE. A
142 self-balancing, two non-tandem wheeled device designed to
143 transport only one individual with an electric propulsion
144 system with an average power of 750 watts (1 h.p.), that has a
145 maximum speed on a paved level surface, when powered solely by
146 the propulsion system while ridden by an operator who weighs
147 not more than 170 pounds, of less than 20 m.p.h. The term
148 shall not include a motorized bicycle, motorized scooter, or
149 motorized skateboard.

150 (18) ESSENTIAL PARTS. All integral and body parts of a
151 vehicle of a type required to be registered under this title,
152 the removal, alteration, or substitution of which would tend
153 to conceal the identity of the vehicle or substantially alter
154 its appearance, model, type, or mode of operation.

155 (19) ESTABLISHED PLACE OF BUSINESS. The place actually
156 occupied either continuously or at regular periods by a dealer
157 or manufacturer where his or her books and records are kept
158 and a large share of his or her business is transacted.

159 (20) EXPLOSIVES. Any chemical compound or mechanical
160 mixture that is commonly used or intended for the purpose of
161 producing an explosion and which contains any oxidizing and
162 combustive units or other ingredients in such proportions,
163 quantities, or packing that an ignition by fire, by friction,
164 by concussion, by percussion, or by detonator of any part of
165 the compound or mixture may cause such a sudden generation of
166 highly heated gases that the resultant gaseous pressures are
167 capable of producing destructive effects on contiguous objects
168 or of destroying life or limb.



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169 (21) FARM TRACTOR. Every motor vehicle designed and
170 used primarily as a farm implement, for drawing plows, mowing
171 machines, and other implements of husbandry.

172 (22) FIRST RESPONDER. Any law enforcement officer,
173 firefighter, paramedic, or emergency medical technician.

174 ~~(22)~~ (23) FLAMMABLE LIQUID. Any liquid which has a flash
175 point of 70 F. or less, as determined by a fagliabue or
176 equivalent closed-cup test device.

177 ~~(23)~~ (24) FOREIGN VEHICLE. Every vehicle of a type
178 required to be registered hereunder brought into this state
179 from another state, territory, or country other than in the
180 ordinary course of business by or through a manufacturer or
181 dealer and not registered in this state.

182 ~~(24)~~ (25) GROSS WEIGHT. The weight of a vehicle without
183 load plus the weight of any load thereon.

184 ~~(25)~~ (26) HIGHWAY. The entire width between the boundary
185 lines of every way publicly maintained when any part thereof
186 is open to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular
187 travel.

188 ~~(26)~~ (27) HOUSE TRAILER. Either of the following:

189 a. A trailer or semitrailer that is designed,
190 constructed, and equipped as a dwelling place, living abode,
191 or sleeping place, either permanently or temporarily, and is
192 equipped for use as a conveyance on streets and highways.

193 b. A trailer or semitrailer that has a chassis and
194 exterior shell that is designed and constructed for use as a
195 house trailer, as defined in paragraph a., but which is used
196 instead permanently or temporarily for the advertising, sales,



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197 display, or promotion of merchandise or services, or for any
198 other commercial purpose except the transportation of property
199 for hire or the transportation of property for distribution by
200 a private carrier.

201 ~~(27)~~ (28) IMPLEMENT OF HUSBANDRY. Every vehicle designed
202 and adapted exclusively for agricultural, horticultural, or
203 livestock raising operations or for lifting or carrying an
204 implement of husbandry and in either case not subject to
205 registration if used upon the highways.

206 ~~(28)~~ (29) INTERSECTION. Any of the following:

207 a. The area embraced within the prolongation or
208 connection of the lateral curb lines, or, if none, then the
209 lateral boundary lines of the roadways of two highways that
210 join one another at, or approximately at, right angles, or the
211 area within which vehicles traveling upon different highways
212 joining at any other angle may come in conflict.

213 b. Where a highway includes two roadways 30 feet or
214 more apart, then every crossing of each roadway of such
215 divided highway by an intersecting highway shall be regarded
216 as a separate intersection. In the event the intersecting
217 highway also includes two roadways 30 feet or more apart, then
218 every crossing of two roadways of such highways shall be
219 regarded as a separate intersection.

220 c. The junction of an alley with a street or highway
221 shall not constitute an intersection.

222 ~~(29)~~ (30) LANED ROADWAY. A roadway that is divided into
223 two or more clearly marked lanes for vehicular traffic.

224 ~~(30)~~ (31) LICENSE or LICENSE TO OPERATE A MOTOR VEHICLE.



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225 Any ~~driver's~~driver license or any other license or permit to
226 operate a motor vehicle issued by the director under the laws
227 of this state, including any nonresident's operating privilege
228 as defined herein.

229 ~~(31)~~(32) LOCAL AUTHORITIES. Either of the following:

230 a. Every county commission.

231 b. Every municipal and other local board or body having
232 authority to enact laws relating to traffic under the
233 constitution and laws of this state.

234 ~~(32)~~(33) MAIL. To deposit in the United States mail
235 properly addressed and with postage prepaid.

236 ~~(33)~~(34) METAL TIRE. Every tire the surface of which in
237 contact with the highway is wholly or partly of metal or other
238 hard, nonresilient material.

239 ~~(34)~~(35) MOTOR VEHICLE. Every vehicle that is
240 self-propelled and every vehicle that is propelled by electric
241 power obtained from overhead trolley wires, but not operated
242 upon rails, except for electric personal assistive mobility
243 devices and electric bicycles.

244 ~~(35)~~(36) MOTORCYCLE. Every motor vehicle having a seat
245 or saddle for the use of the rider and designed to travel on
246 not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, but
247 excluding a tractor and an electric bicycle.

248 ~~(36)~~(37) MOTOR-DRIVEN CYCLE. Every motorcycle,
249 including every motor scooter, with a motor that produces not
250 more than five brake horsepower nor exceeds 150 cubic
251 centimeter engine displacement, and weighs less than 200
252 pounds fully equipped, and every bicycle with a motor



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253 attached. The term does not include electric bicycles.

254 ~~(37)~~(38) NONRESIDENT. Every individual who is not a
255 resident of this state.

256 ~~(38)~~(39) NONRESIDENT'S OPERATING PRIVILEGE. The
257 privilege conferred upon a nonresident by the laws of this
258 state pertaining to the operation by the nonresident of a
259 motor vehicle, or the use of a vehicle owned by the
260 nonresident, in this state.

261 ~~(39)~~(40) OFFICIAL TRAFFIC-CONTROL DEVICES. All signs,
262 signals, markings, and devices not inconsistent with this
263 title placed or erected by authority of a public body or
264 official having jurisdiction, for the purpose of regulating,
265 warning, or guiding traffic.

266 ~~(40)~~(41) OWNER. A person, other than a lienholder,
267 having the property in or title to a vehicle. The term
268 includes a person entitled to the use and possession of a
269 vehicle subject to a security interest in another person, but
270 excludes a lessee under a lease not intended as security.

271 ~~(41)~~(42) PARK or PARKING. The standing of a vehicle,
272 whether occupied or not. The term does not include a vehicle
273 that is stopped temporarily for the purpose of and actually
274 engaged in loading or unloading merchandise or passengers.

275 ~~(42)~~(43) PASSENGER CAR. Every motor vehicle, except
276 motorcycles and motor-driven cycles, designed for carrying 10
277 passengers or less and used for the transportation of
278 individuals.

279 ~~(43)~~(44) PEDESTRIAN. Any individual afoot.

280 ~~(44)~~(45) PERSON. Every individual, firm, copartnership,



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281 association, or corporation.

282 ~~(45)~~(46) PNEUMATIC TIRE. Every tire in which compressed
283 air is designed to support the load.

284 ~~(46)~~(47) POLE TRAILER. Every vehicle without motive
285 power designed to be drawn by another vehicle and attached to
286 the towing vehicle by means of a reach or pole, or by being
287 boomed or otherwise secured to the towing vehicle, and
288 ordinarily used for transporting long or irregularly shaped
289 loads such as poles, pipes, or structural members capable,
290 generally, of sustaining themselves as beams between the
291 supporting connections.

292 ~~(47)~~(48) POLICE OFFICER. Every officer authorized to
293 direct or regulate traffic or to make arrests for violations
294 of traffic regulations.

295 ~~(48)~~(49) PRIVATE ROAD or DRIVEWAY. Every way or place
296 in private ownership and used for vehicular travel by the
297 owner and those having express or implied permission from the
298 owner, but not by other persons.

299 ~~(49)~~(50) RAILROAD. A carrier of individuals or property
300 upon cars other than street cars, operated upon stationary
301 rails.

302 ~~(50)~~(51) RAILROAD SIGN or SIGNAL. Any sign, signal, or
303 device erected by authority of a public body or official or by
304 a railroad and intended to give notice of the presence of
305 railroad tracks or the approach of a railroad train.

306 ~~(51)~~(52) RAILROAD TRAIN. A steam engine, electric or
307 other motor, with or without cars coupled thereto, operated
308 upon rails.



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309 ~~(52)~~(53) RECONSTRUCTED VEHICLE. Every vehicle of a type
310 required to be registered under this title materially altered
311 from its original construction by the removal, addition, or
312 substitution of essential parts, new or used.

313 ~~(53)~~(54) REGISTRATION. The registration certificate or
314 certificates and registration plates issued under the laws of
315 this state pertaining to the registration of vehicles.

316 ~~(54)~~(55) RESIDENCE DISTRICT. The territory contiguous
317 to and including a highway not comprising a business district
318 when the property on the highway for a distance of 300 feet or
319 more is, in the main, improved with residences or residences
320 and buildings in use for business.

321 ~~(55)~~(56) REVOCATION OF ~~DRIVER'S~~DRIVER LICENSE. The
322 termination by formal action of the director of an
323 individual's license or privilege to operate a motor vehicle
324 on the public highways, which termination shall not be subject
325 to renewal or restoration except that an application for a new
326 license may be presented and acted upon by the director after
327 the expiration of the applicable period of time prescribed in
328 this title.

329 ~~(56)~~(57) RIGHT-OF-WAY. The right of one vehicle or
330 pedestrian to proceed in a lawful manner in preference to
331 another vehicle or pedestrian approaching under such
332 circumstances of direction, speed, and proximity as to give
333 rise to danger of collision unless one grants precedence to
334 the other.

335 ~~(57)~~(58) ROAD TRACTOR. Every motor vehicle designed and
336 used for drawing other vehicles and not so constructed as to



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337 carry any load thereon either independently or any part of the
338 weight of a vehicle or load so drawn.

339 ~~(58)~~ (59) ROADWAY. That portion of a highway improved,
340 designed, or ordinarily used for vehicular travel, exclusive
341 of the berm or shoulder. In the event a highway includes two
342 or more separate roadways, the term refers to each roadway
343 separately but not to all roadways collectively.

344 ~~(59)~~ (60) SAFETY ZONE. The area or space officially set
345 apart within a roadway for the exclusive use of pedestrians
346 and which is protected or is so marked or indicated by
347 adequate signs as to be plainly visible at all times while set
348 apart as a safety zone.

349 ~~(60)~~ (61) SCHOOL BUS. Every motor vehicle that complies
350 with the color and identification requirements set forth by
351 law or rule and is used to transport children to or from
352 school or in connection with school activities, but not
353 including buses operated by common carriers in urban
354 transportation of school children.

355 ~~(61)~~ (62) SCOOTER. A device weighing less than 100
356 pounds that satisfies all of the following:

357 a. Has handlebars and an electric motor.

358 b. Is solely powered by the electric motor or human
359 power.

360 c. Has a maximum speed of no more than 20 m.p.h. on a
361 paved level surface when powered solely by the electric motor.

362 This term does not include an e-bike, EPAMD, Segway,
363 motorcycle, or moped.

364 ~~(62)~~ (63) SECURITY AGREEMENT. A written agreement that



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365 reserves or creates a security interest.

366 ~~(63)~~ (64) SECURITY INTEREST. An interest in a vehicle
367 reserved or created by agreement and which secures payment or
368 performance of an obligation. The term includes the interest
369 of a lessor under a lease intended as security. A security
370 interest is perfected when it is valid against third parties
371 generally, subject only to specific statutory exceptions.

372 ~~(64)~~ (65) SEMITRAILER. Every vehicle with or without
373 motive power, other than a pole trailer, designed for carrying
374 individuals or property and for being drawn by a motor vehicle
375 and so constructed that some part of its weight and that of
376 its load rests upon or is carried by another vehicle.

377 ~~(65)~~ (66) SHARED MICROMOBILITY DEVICE. A type of
378 transportation device that includes a bicycle, electric
379 bicycle, tricycle, scooter, hoverboard, skateboard, pedal car,
380 or similar device, except a device used as an electrical
381 personal assistive mobility device by an individual with
382 disabilities, used in a shared micromobility device system.

383 ~~(66)~~ (67) SHARED MICROMOBILITY DEVICE SYSTEM. A system
384 that provides shared micromobility devices to users for
385 short-term rentals, whether or not the system requires docking
386 stations or other similar fixed infrastructure to receive or
387 return the shared micromobility device.

388 ~~(67)~~ (68) SIDEWALK. That portion of a street between the
389 curb lines, or the lateral lines of a roadway, and the
390 adjacent property lines, intended for use by pedestrians.

391 ~~(68)~~ (69) SOLID TIRE. Every tire of rubber or other
392 resilient material which does not depend upon compressed air



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393 for the support of the load.

394 ~~(69)~~ (70) SPECIAL MOBILE EQUIPMENT. Every vehicle not
395 designed or used primarily for the transportation of
396 individuals or property and only incidentally operated or
397 moved over a highway, including, but not limited to: Ditch
398 digging apparatus, well boring apparatus, and road
399 construction and maintenance machinery such as asphalt
400 spreaders, bituminous mixers, bucket loaders, tractors other
401 than truck tractors, ditchers, levelling graders, finishing
402 machines, motor graders, road rollers, scarifiers, earth
403 moving carry-alls and scrapers, power shovels and drag lines,
404 and self-propelled cranes, and earth moving equipment. The
405 term does not include house trailers, dump trucks, truck
406 mounted transit mixers, cranes or shovels, or other vehicles
407 designed for the transportation of individuals or property to
408 which machinery has been attached.

409 ~~(70)~~ (71) SPECIALLY CONSTRUCTED VEHICLE. Every vehicle
410 of a type required to be registered under this title not
411 originally constructed under a distinctive name, make, model,
412 or type by a generally recognized manufacturer of vehicles and
413 not materially altered from its original construction.

414 ~~(71)~~ (72) STAND or STANDING. The halting of a vehicle,
415 whether occupied or not. The term does not include a vehicle
416 that is halted temporarily for the purpose of and actually
417 engaged in receiving or discharging passengers.

418 ~~(72)~~ (73) STATE. A state, territory, or possession of
419 the United States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth
420 of Puerto Rico, or a province of Canada.



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421 ~~(73)~~(74) STOP. When required, means complete cessation
422 from movement.

423 ~~(74)~~(75) STOP or STOPPING. When prohibited, means any
424 halting, even momentarily, of a vehicle, whether occupied or
425 not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other
426 traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police
427 officer or traffic-control sign or signal.

428 ~~(75)~~(76) STREET. The entire width between boundary
429 lines of every way publicly maintained when any part thereof
430 is open to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular
431 travel.

432 ~~(76)~~(77) SUSPENSION OF ~~DRIVER'S~~DRIVER LICENSE. The
433 temporary withdrawal by formal action of the Secretary of the
434 Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency of an individual's driver
435 license or privilege to operate a motor vehicle on the public
436 highways, which temporary withdrawal shall be for a period
437 specifically designated by the secretary.

438 ~~(77)~~(78) THROUGH HIGHWAY. Every highway or portion
439 thereof on which vehicular traffic is given preferential
440 right-of-way, and at the entrances to which vehicular traffic
441 from intersecting highways is required by law to yield the
442 right-of-way to vehicles on such through highway in obedience
443 to a stop sign, yield sign, or other official traffic-control
444 device, when such signs or devices are erected as provided in
445 this title.

446 ~~(78)~~(79) TRACKLESS TROLLEY COACH. Every motor vehicle
447 which is propelled by electric power obtained from overhead
448 trolley wires but not operated upon rails.



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449 ~~(79)~~(80) TRAFFIC. Pedestrians, ridden or herded
450 animals, vehicles, streetcars, and other conveyances, either
451 singly or together, while using any highway for purposes of
452 travel.

453 ~~(80)~~(81) TRAFFIC-CONTROL SIGNAL. Any device, whether
454 manually, electrically, or mechanically operated, by which
455 traffic is alternately directed to stop and permitted to
456 proceed.

457 ~~(81)~~(82) TRAILER. Every vehicle with or without motive
458 power, other than a pole trailer, designed for carrying
459 individuals or property and for being drawn by a motor vehicle
460 and so constructed that no part of its weight rests upon the
461 towing vehicle.

462 ~~(82)~~(83) TRANSPORTER. Every person engaged in the
463 business of delivering vehicles of a type required to be
464 registered under this title from a manufacturing, assembling,
465 or distributing plant to dealers or sales agents of a
466 manufacturer.

467 ~~(83)~~(84) TRUCK. Every motor vehicle designed, used, or
468 maintained primarily for the transportation of property.

469 ~~(84)~~(85) TRUCK PLATOON. A group of individual
470 commercial trucks traveling in a unified manner at
471 electronically coordinated speeds at following distances that
472 are closer than would be reasonable and prudent without the
473 electronic coordination.

474 ~~(85)~~(86) TRUCK TRACTOR. Every motor vehicle designed
475 and used primarily for drawing other vehicles and not so
476 constructed as to carry a load other than a part of the weight



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477 of the vehicle and load so drawn.

478 ~~(86)~~ (87) URBAN DISTRICT. The territory contiguous to
479 and including any street which is built up with structures
480 devoted to business, industry, or dwelling houses situated at
481 intervals of less than 100 feet for a distance of a quarter of
482 a mile or more.

483 ~~(87)~~ (88) VEHICLE. Every device in, upon, or by which
484 any individual or property is or may be transported or drawn
485 upon a highway, excepting devices moved by human power or used
486 exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks or electric
487 personal assistive mobility devices; provided, that for the
488 purposes of this title, a bicycle, an electric bicycle, or a
489 ridden animal shall be deemed a vehicle, except those
490 provisions of this title, which by their very nature can have
491 no application."

492 Section 3. This act shall become effective on October
493 1, 2024.
