8	SYNOPSIS:	Under existing law, the Department of
9		Transportation and county commissions may designate
10		areas along the county roads and highways of the
11		state as construction zones and may set reduced
12		speed construction zone speed limits.
13		Existing law also provides that a person who
14		commits a violation of a construction zone speed
15		limit shall be assessed a fine of double the amount
16		prescribed by law outside of a construction zone.
17		This bill would further provide for the
18		violation to include all moving violations
19		committed within a construction zone while workers
20		are present and while there are work zone traffic
21		control devices or warning signs present to notify
22		motorists of construction and maintenance workers
23		in the area.
24		This bill would provide that the penalty for
25		a construction zone violation is the greater of
26		\$250 or double the amount prescribed by law outside

of a construction zone.

1	Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
2	of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
3	Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
4	Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
5	law whose purpose or effect would be to require a
6	new or increased expenditure of local funds from
7	becoming effective with regard to a local
8	governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote
9	unless: it comes within one of a number of
10	specified exceptions; it is approved by the
11	affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates
12	funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to
13	the entity for the purpose.
14	The purpose or effect of this bill would be
15	to require a new or increased expenditure of local
16	funds within the meaning of the amendment. However,
17	the bill does not require approval of a local
18	governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to
19	become effective because it comes within one of the
20	specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:		
10	Section 1. Section 32-5A-176.1, Code of Alabama		
11	1975, is amended to read as follows:		
12	"§32-5A-176.1.		
13	"(a) A person commits a construction zone moving		
14	violation if, while operating a motor vehicle, he or she		
15	commits any violation of Chapter 5 or Chapter 5A of Title 32		
16	under all of the following conditions:		
17	"(1) The person is in a construction zone designated		
18	by the Department of Transportation or a political subdivision		
19	of the state.		
20	"(2) Construction or maintenance workers are present		
21	and performing construction or maintenance work.		
22	"(3) There are work zone traffic control devices,		
23	traffic controls, or warning signs present to notify motorists		
24	and pedestrians of construction or maintenance workers in the		
25	area.		
26	"(a) (b) The State Department of Transportation may		
27	set the speed limits in urban and rural construction zones		

along state and interstate highways and the county commission of a county may set the speed limits in urban and rural construction zones along county roads or highways. The construction zone speed limits shall be posted on the department's standard size speed limit signs at least one hundred feet in advance of the entrance to a construction zone. Law enforcement authorities shall enforce construction zone speed limits.

"(c) Upon conviction of a construction zone speed moving violation, the operator of the motor vehicle shall be assessed a fine of the greater of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) or double the amount prescribed by law outside a construction zone. The fine shall only be doubled for construction zone violations if construction personnel are present and that fact is indicated by appropriate signs.

"(d) The Warning signs, shall be placed at the entrance of the construction zone, and shall warn of the doubled additional fines for speeding committing a moving violation within a construction zone. The signs shall also state that the doubled additional fines are applicable only when construction personnel are present.

"(b) (e) The State Department of Transportation may promulgate adopt and implement administrative rules and procedures as it deems necessary to both carry out the provisions of subsection (a) on state and interstate highways and enforce this section and to ensure the safety of private and public construction and maintenance personnel working in

designated construction zones on state and interstate

highways. A county commission may promulgate and implement

administrative rules and procedures as it deems necessary to

carry out the provisions of subsection (a) enforce this

section on county roads and highways, provided the rules and

procedures are not in conflict with those set by the State

Department of Transportation.

"(c) $\underline{\text{(f)}}$ A person subject to a penalty pursuant to this section $\underline{\text{shall }}$ may not be assessed additional court costs on conviction."

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
