13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:		
14	Section 1. Section 17-3-8, Code of Alabama 1975, as		
15	last amended by Act 2022-112 of the 2022 Regular Session, is		
16	amended to read as follows:

18	(a) Each member of the board of registrars in the		
19	Counties of Clay, Cleburne, Coosa, Dallas, Escambia, Geneva,		
20	Lowndes, Perry, Sumter, and Wilcox may meet a maximum of 120		
21	working days each fiscal year; each member of the board of		
22	registrars in the Counties of Barbour, Blount, Butler,		
23	Fayette, Greene, Marengo, Pickens, Pike, Randolph, and Winstor		
24	may meet a maximum of 168 working days each fiscal year,		
25	except in Pike County each board of registrars may meet up to		
26	an additional 30 session days each fiscal year, at the		
27	discretion of the chair of the county commission, and such		
28	days shall be paid from the respective county funds; each		



29 member of the board of registrars in the Counties of Coffee, 30 Talladega, and Tallapoosa may meet a maximum of 220 working 31 days each fiscal year, except that in Talladega County the 32 board of registrars may meet up to an additional 30 session 33 days each fiscal year, at the discretion of the chair of the 34 county commission; each member of the board of registrars in 35 the Counties of Dale, Franklin, Houston, Marion, Marshall, 36 Bullock, Macon, and Tuscaloosa may meet a maximum of 216 37 working days each fiscal year; each member of the board of registrars in the Counties of Limestone and Shelby may meet a 38 39 maximum of 167 working days each fiscal year; and each member of the board of registrars in Russell County may meet a 40 maximum of 177 working days each fiscal year. (b) In the 41 42 Counties of Choctaw, Colbert, Cullman, Lauderdale, and Monroe, 43 each member of the board of registrars may meet a maximum of 44 199 working days each fiscal year.

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(c) Each member of the Board of Registrars of Autauga, Elmore, and Bibb Counties may meet a maximum of 187 working days each fiscal year. Each member of the Board of Registrars of Walker County may meet a maximum of 200 days each fiscal year, and each member of the Board of Registrars of Lamar, Cherokee, Clarke, Conecuh, Crenshaw, Hale, and Washington Counties may meet a maximum of 140 days each fiscal year. Each member of the board of registrars in the following counties may meet the following maximum number of working days each fiscal year: Henry - 140 working days; Covington - 188 working days; DeKalb, - 207 working days; Jackson, and Blount - 207 working days; Chambers - 180 working days; and Lawrence - 140



57 working days.

- (d) Each member of the board of registrars in the Counties of Baldwin, Calhoun, Chilton, Etowah, Lee, Madison, Mobile, Montgomery, St. Clair, and Morgan are authorized to meet not more than five days each week for the purpose of carrying out their official duties. Jefferson County, which is now operating under the provisions of local laws, shall be exempted from this section. Provided, however, that where the term each year is used in the local laws the term means each fiscal year.
- (e) The actual number of working days to be used as session days shall be determined by a quorum of the board of registrars according to the needs of the county.
- used for special registration sessions (i.e., those sessions held away from the courthouse in the several precincts of the county or sessions held on Saturday or between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m.). Notice of any special session scheduled by the board shall be given at least 10 days prior to the special session by: (1) Bills posted at three or more public places in each election precinct affected, if the session involves precinct visits; and (2) advertisement once a week for two successive weeks in a newspaper published in the county or by radio or television announcements on a local station, or both by newspaper or announcement."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
