This bill would require that a county or municipality using the services of a county or municipal police officer, who is injured while on duty and the injury is a result of the county or municipal law enforcement officer acting within the scope of his or her job duties, is required to compensate a county or municipal law enforcement officer throughout the officer's period of recovery at the normal rate of compensation in effect for the officer at the time of injury.

Relating to county and municipal law enforcement officers; to require that a county or municipality using the services of a county or municipal law enforcement officer, who is injured while on duty and the injury is a result of the county or municipal law enforcement officer acting within the scope of his or her job duties, is required to compensate a county or municipal law enforcement officer throughout the officer's period of recovery at the normal rate of compensation in effect for the officer at the time of injury BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) For purposes of this section, a "county law enforcement officer" is a full-time law enforcement officer of any county, who is certified by the Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission and who has no limited authority within the county except as otherwise provided by law.

(b) For purposes of this section, a "municipal law enforcement officer" is a full-time law enforcement officer of any municipality, who is certified by the Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission and who has no limited authority within the municipality except as otherwise provided by law.

(c) When a county or municipal law enforcement officer being used by a county or municipality is injured while on duty and his or her injury or injuries were not the result of his or her willful conduct, and the injury resulted when the officer was in conflict, pursuit, or observation of a person or persons suspected or under suspicion of breaking the law, or has broken the law, or is in the process of breaking the law, or when the officer is defending persons or property in the line of duty, the county or municipality using the services of the officer at the time of the injury shall compensate the officer throughout the entire period of recovery, as determined by the doctor or doctors treating the injury or injuries, at the normal rate of compensation in effect for the county or municipal law enforcement officer at the time of injury.

(d) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any compensation, which is provided as a benefit of employment, to a county or municipal law enforcement officer through an insurance carrier or self-insurer, shall count toward the officer's normal rate of compensation. If the compensation provided through the insurance carrier or self-insurer is less than the officer's normal rate of compensation, then the county or municipality shall pay the officer an additional amount that would equal the officer's normal rate of compensation when combined with the compensation from the insurance carrier or the self-insurer.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
