To amend the Constitution of Alabama of 1901 to repeal Amendments 386, 387, 413, 440, 506, 508, 542, 549, 550, 565, 569, 599, 600, 612, 674, 692, 732, 743, and 744 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901 that authorize bingo to be conducted by or on behalf of nonprofit organizations in Calhoun County, Covington County, Etowah County, Greene County, Houston County, Jefferson County, Limestone County, Macon County, Lowndes County, Madison County, Mobile County, Morgan County, Montgomery County, Walker County, the City of Jasper, the Town of White Hall in Lowndes County, Russell County, and St. Clair County.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of Alabama is hereby proposed and shall become valid as a part of said Constitution when approved in accordance with such provisions of Sections 284, 285, and 287 of said Constitution and Amendment No. 555 thereto as shall be applicable:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Amendments 386, 387, 413, 440, 506, 508, 542, 549, 550, 565, 569, 599, 600, 612, 674, 692, 732, 743, and 744 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901 that authorize bingo to be conducted by or on behalf of nonprofit organizations in Calhoun County, Covington County, Etowah County, Greene County, Houston County, Jefferson County, Limestone County, Macon County, Lowndes County, Madison County, Mobile County, Morgan County, Montgomery County, Walker County, the City of

Jasper, the Town of White Hall in Lowndes County, Russell 1 2 County, and St. Clair County are hereby repealed. Section 2. The election on said proposed amendment 3 4 shall be held in accordance with the provisions of Sections 5 284 and 285 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the Code of Alabama 1975, Title 17, Chapter 17; 6 7 however, such amendment shall be on the party primary ballot for 2010. 8 Section 3. Section 4. Notice of the election shall be given by proclamation of the Governor, which proclamation, including the full text of the proposed amendment, shall be published once a week for four successive weeks next preceding the date appointed for the election in a newspaper published in each county of the state. In each county in which no newspaper is published, a copy of the proclamation of the Governor, giving notice of the election and the full text of the proposed amendment, shall be posted at each courthouse in such county.
