any durable medical equipment or medical supplies that is paid 1 2 for by Medicare, Medicaid, or a health benefit plan pursuant to the prescription of a physician, the sale, rental, lease, 3 4 or use of the durable medical equipment or medical supplies shall not be subject to sales or use tax or lease or rental 6 tax. Notwithstanding the foregoing, when a provider requires a 7 person to pay a co-payment on an item covered in part by a health benefit plan, tax may be paid on the co-payment amount 8 paid by the person who purchases, receives, or uses the property.

Section 2. This act is supplemental and shall not repeal any other law not in direct conflict with this act.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
