- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 9 Section 1. Sections 32-6-157, 32-6-231, 32-6-231.1,
- 10 32-6-231.2, and 40-12-300, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 "\$32-6-157
- Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
- 14 contrary, distinctive and personalized license plates may be
- issued to trucks with gross vehicle weight not exceeding
- 16 10,000 pounds; provided, the provisions of this section shall
- 17 not apply to distinctive military license plates or plates
- 18 with the International Symbol of Access Dynamic Accessibility
- 19 Symbol."

- 21 (a) Any personindividual who submits to the license
- 22 issuing official a completed special access parking or
- 23 disability access parking application form approved by the
- 24 Commissioner of Revenue which includes the physician's
- 25 certification that he or she is an individual with a
- 26 disability shall be issued one removable windshield placard
- 27 displaying the International Symbol of Access Dynamic
- 28 Accessibility Symbol thereby designating the driver of the



vehicle or the passenger as being an individual with a disability.

- 31 (1) The removable windshield placard shall be prepared 32 by the commissioner in conformity to Public Law 100-641 and 33 rulemaking resulting therefrom.
 - (2) a. The removable windshield placard issued to the individual with a long-term disability shall expire after a maximum period of five years or any period less than five years to be designated by the commissioner. The placard shall clearly reveal the expiration date and shall be designed in accordance with Public Law 100-641 and rulemaking resulting therefrom to hang from the front windshield rearview mirror when the vehicle is parked in a parking space reserved for persons individuals with disabilities. If the vehicle lacks a rearview mirror, the placard shall be placed on the dashboard.
 - b. The commissioner may require all <u>persons</u> individuals with long-term disabilities to be recertified by a licensed physician before special access or disability access parking removable windshield placards may be reissued.
 - (3) In the event that an individual with a disability does not have the distinctive special access or disability access license plate as provided by Sections 40-12-300 to 40-12-302, inclusive, upon request, a second placard may be issued.

 - (c) An individual with a temporary disability, who submits to the license issuing official a completed special

- (a) For the purpose of <u>parking spaces reserved for</u>

 <u>persons with disabilitiesthis section</u>, the term "military

 distinctive license plate" includes any of the following:

 Medal of Honor license plate; Prisoners of War license plate;

 Purple Heart Medal Recipients license plate; retired military

 license plate; National Guard license plate; disabled veteran

 license plate; Pearl Harbor survivors license plate; World War

 II veterans license plate; Korean War veterans license plate;

 veterans of the Battle of the Bulge license plate; veterans of

 Desert Shield/Desert Storm license plate; Vietnam veterans

 license plate; veterans of the United States Armed Forces

 exposed to dangerous levels of radiation due to the atomic

 bomb and weapons testing from 1944 to 1962 license plate; and

 any subsequently enacted distinctive license plates issued

 exclusively to veterans.
 - (b) Any personindividual qualified to receive a



85 military distinctive license plate pursuant to this chapter, 86 who submits to the judge of probate, license commissioner, or 87 other issuing official authority medical proof satisfactory to 88 the Commissioner of Revenue that he or she is a handicapped an individual with a disability in accordance with Public Law 89 100-641 and rulemaking resulting therefrom, shall be issued a 90 91 distinctive military license plate which is inscribed with the 92 International Symbol of AccessDynamic Accessibility Symbol 93 designating the vehicle owner as being a handicapped an individual with a disability. The Commissioner of Revenue 94 95 shall adopt procedures for the issuance of these distinctive military license plates containing the International Symbol of 96 97 Access Dynamic Accessibility Symbol. Handicapped 98 individuals Individuals with disabilities displaying these 99 plates shall be allowed to park in parking zones designated reserved for handicapped personsindividuals with disabilities 100 101 upon the payment of parking fees the same as any other 102 personindividual." 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(a) Commencing on January 1, 2022, a vehicle owner who is qualified to receive a distinctive license plate pursuant to this chapter, who has a long-term disability, as defined in Section 32-6-230, and who submits to the judge of probate, license commissioner, or other issuing authority medical proof satisfactory to the Commissioner of Revenue that he or she is a disabled an individual with a disability in accordance with Public Law 100-641 and rulemaking resulting therefrom, may be issued a license plate under this chapter or Chapter 12 of

- (c) Any government agency that applies for a license plate for a vehicle—which that it owns for the primary purpose of transporting individuals with disabilities shall be issued the requested number of license plates according to Section 40-12-250, with the plate displaying the International Symbol of AccessDynamic Accessibility Symbol embossed on the plate.
- (d) The distinctive license plates shall be used only upon and for personally-owned, private, or government owned and operated passenger vehicles, including, but not limited to, vans, station wagons, buses, motorcycles, and pickup trucks, registered in the name of the personindividual, or public or private agency, nursing home, church, or charitable institution making application therefor, and when issued to the applicant shall be used upon the vehicle for which issued in lieu of the standard license plates normally issued for the vehicle. This division shall not be construed to require an individual with a disability to display a distinctive special access or disability access license plate. It is—hereby specifically provided that this division shall be construed in pari materia with Section 32-6-231. The commissioner may make any rules or regulations—necessary to carry out this division.
- (e) The commissioner may require all persons individuals with long-term disabilities to be recertified by a licensed physician before special access parking or disability access
