BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 36-6-6, Code of Alabama 1975, is
amended to read as follows:

4 "\$36-6-6.

"(a) Unless otherwise fixed by law, the salaries of 5 appointed department heads or those otherwise considered 6 7 members of the Governor's cabinet, the salaries of the appointed assistant department heads or those otherwise 8 considered as the Governor's assistant cabinet members, and 9 10 the salaries of other officers and employees appointed in the 11 exempt service and the executive assistants in the Governor's 12 office shall be fixed by the Governor in accordance with the 13 recommendations by the State Personnel Board of appropriate pay ranges within the state pay plan. 14

15 "(b) Where some authority other than the Governor 16 appoints such an officer or employee, the salary shall be 17 fixed by the appointing authority with the approval of the 18 Governor and the State Personnel Board.

"(c) In fixing such salaries, the Governor or other appointing authority shall give due consideration to the salaries of comparable positions in other states and in private industry in Alabama.

"(d) Any salary increase provided pursuant to this
 section shall not exceed three percent per year."

25 Section 2. This act shall become effective 26 immediately following its passage and approval by the 27 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
