4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, the Department of
6	Conservation and Natural Resources is responsible for
7	regulating hunting.
8	This bill would further provide for the season
9	during which dogs may be used to hunt deer in certain
10	counties in this state.
11	This bill would provide penalties for violations
12	relating to hunting deer with dogs.
13	This bill would require the Commissioner of the
14	Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to
15	provide a semiannual report detailing all citations and
16	warnings issued by game wardens to the Legislature,
17	advisory board of the department, and public.
18	This bill would also make nonsubstantive,
19	technical revisions to update the existing code
20	language to current style
21	Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of
22	2022, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect
23	would be to require a new or increased expenditure of
24	local funds from becoming effective with regard to a
25	local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3
26	vote unless: it comes within one of a number of
27	specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected
28	entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or

29 provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for 30 the purpose. 31 32 The purpose or effect of this bill would be to 33 require a new or increased expenditure of local funds 34 within the meaning of the section. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental 35 36 entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective 37 because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the section. 38 39 40 41 A BILL 42 TO BE ENTITLED 43 AN ACT 44 45 Relating to deer hunting; to further provide for the 46 hunting of deer using dogs in certain counties; to provide 47 penalties for violations; to amend Section 9-2-14, Code of 48 Alabama 1975, to require the Commissioner of the Department of 49 Conservation and Natural Resources to provide a semiannual 50 report detailing the citations and warnings issued by game 51 wardens; and to make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to

52 update the existing code language to current style; and in 53 connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the 54 requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds 55 within the meaning of Section 111.05 of the Constitution of 56 Alabama of 2022.



57 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

58 Section 1. (a) All dogs used for taking or attempting 59 to take, trailing, pursuing, or disturbing deer or blood 60 tracking must wear a collar or tag legibly displaying the name 61 and phone number of the owner of the dog.

(b) (1) No individual shall remove, tamper, or otherwise
interfere with any collar or tag, including a remote tracking
and behavior correction device, of a dog used for hunting
without the owner's permission.

66 (2) A violation of subsection (b) shall be punishable
67 by a fine of one thousand dollar (\$1,000) to be collected by
68 the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.

69 Section 2. Game wardens employed by the Department of 70 Conservation and Natural Resources shall investigate any 71 reported incident of a dog being intentionally killed or 72 injured while engaged in hunting activities to determine if 73 the crime of cruelty to animals has been committed as provided 74 in Section 13A-11-14, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 3. (a) This section shall only apply to a county, or portion thereof, in which hunting deer with dogs was prohibited prior to the 2022-2023 deer hunting season based on an action taken by the Advisory Board of Conservation and Natural Resources or through a limitation of season dates by the Commissioner of Conservation and Natural Resources.

(b) Commencing on July 1, 2025, hunting deer using dogs shall be allowed in those counties, or portions thereof, as provided in subsection (a). The 2025-2026 deer hunting season shall have a minimum of 21 days on which hunting deer with



dogs is allowed. The 2026-2027 deer hunting season shall have a minimum of 30 days on which hunting deer with dogs is allowed. The 2027-2028 deer hunting season, and every deer hunting season thereafter, shall have a minimum of 45 days on which hunting deer with dogs is allowed.

90 Section 4. (a) No hunter using dogs to hunt deer may 91 knowingly or negligently cast the dogs onto any property, nor 92 allow the dogs to trail or pursue game onto any property, 93 without the prior written consent of the landowner or being 94 accompanied by the landowner or person in possession or 95 control of the land.

96 (b) A first violation of this section shall result in a 97 one hundred dollar (\$100) fine. A second violation within the 98 same deer hunting season shall result in a two hundred fifty 99 dollar (\$250) fine. A third or subsequent violation within the 100 same deer hunting season shall result in a five hundred dollar 101 (\$500) fine.

Section 5. (a) A hunter using dogs to hunt deer shall equip each dog with an electronic tracking and correction collar. The collar shall be in use any time a dog is on the ground and participating in a hunt. The collar shall not be required to be worn when a dog is kenneled or in a transport dog box.

(b) A first violation of this section shall result in a warning. A second violation within the same deer hunting season shall result in a two hundred fifty dollar (\$250) fine. A third or subsequent violation within the same deer hunting season shall result in a five hundred dollar (\$500) fine.



Section 6. Section 9-2-14, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

115 "\$9-2-14

116 (a) There shall be an Advisory Board of Conservation and Natural Resources. The board shall consist of the 117 118 Governor, the Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries, the 119 Director of the Agricultural Extension System ex officio, and 120 10 other members to be appointed by the Governor, one of whom 121 the Governor shall designate as chair Chair of the Advisory Board of Conservation and Natural Resources. The appointed 122 123 members of the board shall be selected with special reference 124 to training and experience along one or more of the principal 125 lines of activity vested in the Department of Conservation and 126 Natural Resources. The Governor shall coordinate his or her 127 appointments to assure the board's membership is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and 128 129 economic diversity of this state. The term of office of each 130 appointed member of the board shall be six years. Of members 131 first appointed, however, two members shall be appointed for 132 two years, three members shall be appointed for four years, 133 two members shall be appointed for five years, and three 134 members shall be appointed for six years. The members of the 135 board shall receive no salary or compensation as members of the board, but shall be reimbursed for expenses of travel, 136 137 meals, and lodging while in the performance of their duties as members of the board, pursuant to Article 2 of Chapter 7 of 138 Title 36. 139

(b) After July 1, 1998, the members of the advisory



141 board appointed by the Governor shall be appointed so that one 142 member of the board is a resident of each congressional 143 district as the districts are constituted on January 1, 1998, 144 and no more than two members are residents of the same 145 congressional district. If a member appointed from a 146 congressional district ceases to be a resident of the district 147 from which appointed, the member shall vacate his or her 148 office. This subsection shall not affect the term or 149 reappointment of any current member of the board.

150 (c) (1) The board shall hold semiannual regular meetings 151 at the time and place designated by the chair of the board or 152 the Commissioner of Conservation and Natural Resources. The 153 chair of the board or the <u>Commissioner of Conservation and</u> 154 <u>Natural Resources commissioner</u> may call special meetings as 155 may be necessary.

(2) Prior to each semiannual meeting of the board, the 156 157 commissioner shall provide a report detailing all citations 158 and warnings issued by game wardens for violations of fish and 159 game laws and rules within this state during the period of 160 time following the previous semiannual meeting. The report 161 shall be structured in a manner that provides the law or rule 162 violated for each citation or warning and the county in which 163 the violation occurred. The report shall also be provided to 164 the Chair of the House of Representatives State Agriculture 165 and Forestry Committee, the Chair of the Senate Agriculture, 166 Conservation, and Forestry Committee, and be made public record when it is provided to the board. 167

168 (d) The Commissioner of Conservation and Natural



169 Resources shall be ex officio secretary of the board and shall 170 keep minutes of all meetings and a record of all proceedings 171 of the board. The commissioner shall receive no additional 172 compensation for the services.

173 (e) On a transitional basis, one additional transitional member of the Advisory Board of Conservation and 174 175 Natural Resources board shall be appointed by the Governor 176 from each congressional district as constituted on January 1, 177 1998, which is not currently represented on the board. A transitional member shall serve a term of six years or until a 178 179 permanent member of the advisory board is appointed to represent the congressional district where the transitional 180 181 member resides. A transitional member may be appointed a permanent member to a full term of office. Transitional 182 183 members of the board shall have the same powers, rights, and duties, and shall be reimbursed for expenses in the same 184 185 manner as other members of the advisory board during their 186 service on the board.

187 (f) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, any 188 action taken by the commissioner or the board that results in 189 the closure or diminishment of the ability of a private 190 landowner to hunt deer with dogs or to allow the hunting of deer with dogs on his or her owned land shall be subject to 191 192 the Alabama Administrative Procedure Act, Chapter 22 of Title 193 41. This includes the establishment of dates for a season 194 during which deer may be hunted using dogs. (g) The department shall adopt rules to implement this 195

196 section."



197 Section 7. Although this bill would have as its purpose 198 or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of 199 local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements 200 and application under Section 111.05 of the Constitution of 201 Alabama of 2022, because the bill defines a new crime or 202 amends the definition of an existing crime.

203 Section 8. This act shall become effective on October 204 1, 2024.
