5	TO BE ENTITLED
6	AN ACT
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9	Relating to Baldwin County; to transfer certain duties
10	related to motor vehicle licenses, tags, and taxes to the
11	county revenue commissioner; and to create the position of
12	License Coordinator in the office of the county commissioner.
13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. This act shall only apply in Baldwin County.
15	Section 2. (a) Commencing on October 1, 2024, the
16	duties and responsibilities of the county revenue commissioner
17	relating to the assessment, licensing, and registration of
18	motor vehicles shall include the administration and
19	enforcement of motor vehicle title registration, processing,
20	and transfer; motor vehicle ad valorem tax assessment and
21	collection; motor vehicle license and license plate issuance;
22	collection of any motor vehicle license and license plat fees
23	or monies due and remitting the proper amounts due to the
24	state and to the county; enforcement of laws relating to these
25	functions; and the collection of penalties and assessments
26	imposed for violations of laws relating to these functions.
27	(b)(1) All duties required by law of the license
28	inspector and judge of probate related to licensing,

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29 assessment, and collection of ad valorem taxes on motor 30 vehicles shall be performed and exercised by the county 31 revenue commissioner.

32 (2) The license inspector and the judge of probate are 33 relieved of all duties and responsibilities related to 34 licensing, assessment, and collection of ad valorem taxes on 35 motor vehicles.

36 (3) The Department of Revenue shall furnish the county
37 revenue commissioner with all forms and materials necessary
38 for the licensing, assessment, and collection of the taxes.

39 (c) The county revenue commissioner shall collect the same fees, charges, penalties, and commissions fixed by law to 40 41 be paid to a license inspector, tax assessor, tax collector, 42 or judge of probate for the licensing, assessment, and 43 collection of state and county ad valorem taxes on motor 44 vehicles. The fees, charges, penalties, and commissions 45 collected by the county revenue commissioner shall be paid 46 into the county general fund.

(d) The position of License Coordinator is created within the office of the county revenue commissioner, and shall serve as a classified employee hired by the county revenue commissioner. All costs associated with the hiring of the license coordinator shall be paid out of the county general fund.

53 Section 3. This act shall become effective on October 54 1, 2024.
