148967-2:n:02/26/2013:JMH/tan LRS2013-1006R1 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 SYNOPSIS: The Commissioner of Agriculture and 8 Industries is charged with annual testing of all 9 10 scales, weights, and measures used in making the 11 receipts and disbursements of supplies in every institution for the maintenance of which monies are 12 13 appropriated by the Legislature. 14 This bill would require owners of weighing and measuring devices to use a registered service 15 16 agent to perform such testing and inspections. 17 This bill would require a registered service 18 agent to register with the Department of 19 Agriculture and Industries. 20 This bill would authorize the department to 21 provide for the inspection of weighing and 22 measuring devices by registered service agent. 23 This bill would also authorize the Board of 24 Agriculture and Industries to adopt a schedule of 25 civil fines for violations related to weights and 26 measures. 27

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5	To amend Sections 8-16-1, 8-16-6, 8-16-7, and
6	8-16-18, Code of Alabama 1975, to define registered service
7	agent and to provide further for the duties of the
8	Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries with respect to a
9	registered service agent; to require the annual testing and
10	inspection of all weighing or measuring devices to be
11	performed by a registered service agent; and to authorize the
12	Board of Agriculture and Industries to adopt a schedule of
13	civil fines for violations related to weights and measures.
14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
15	Section 1. Sections 8-16-1, 8-16-6, 8-16-7, and
16	8-16-18, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:
17	"§8-16-1.
18	"For the purposes of this chapter, the following
19	terms shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them by
20	this section:
21	"(1) REGISTERED SERVICE AGENT. Any individual,
22	agency, firm, company, or corporation that for hire,
23	commission, or other payment of any kind, services, repairs,
24	or reconditions any weighing or measuring devices, and that
25	registers with the Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries.
26	"(2) SELL or SALE. Such terms shall include barter
27	and exchange.

"(1)(3) WEIGHTS, MEASURES or WEIGHING OR MEASURING
DEVICES. Such terms include all weights, scales, beams,
measures of every kind, instruments and mechanical devices for
weighing, or measuring, and any appliances and accessories
connected with any or all such instruments.

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"§8-16-6.

7 "<u>(a)</u> With respect to weights and measures, the 8 Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries shall have the 9 following duties:

10 "(1) He shall To try and prove by the state
11 standards, at least once in five years, all weights, measures,
12 and other apparatus which may belong to any county or city and
13 shall seal such when found to be accurate, stamping on them
14 the letter "A" and the last two figures of the year with seals
15 which he or she shall have and keep for that purpose.

"(2) He shall To have and keep a general supervision
of the weights, measures, and weighing and measuring devices
offered for sale, sold, or in use in the state.

19 "(3) Upon the written request of any citizen, firm, 20 corporation, or educational institution in the state, he shall 21 <u>to</u> test or calibrate weights, measures, weighing, or measuring 22 devices, and instruments or apparatus used as standards in 23 this state.

"(4) He shall <u>To assure that</u> at least once annually
 test all scales, weights, and measures used in checking the
 receipts and disbursements of supplies in every institution
 for the maintenance of which moneys are appropriated by the

Legislature are inspected, and he shall report in writing his 1 2 or her findings through the supervisory board and to the executive officer of the institution concerned. At the request 3 of such board or executive officer, the Commissioner of 4 Agriculture and Industries shall appoint in writing one or 5 6 more employees then in the actual service of each institution 7 who shall act as special deputy or deputies, without extra compensation, for the purpose of checking the receipts and 8 disbursements of supplies. 9

10 "(5) He shall include <u>To include</u> a report of the 11 work done by his <u>or her</u> office in his general report to the 12 State Board of Agriculture and Industries.

"(6) He shall inspect <u>To inspect</u> all standards and apparatus used by the counties and cities at least once in five years and shall keep a record of the same.

16 "(7) He shall, at <u>At</u> least once in five years, <u>to</u> 17 visit the various cities and counties of the state in order to 18 inspect the work of the local sealers of weights and measures; 19 and.

"(8) He shall issue <u>To issue</u> from time to time
 regulations for guidance for city and county sealers, and the
 said regulations shall govern the procedure to be followed by
 the aforesaid <u>these</u> officers in the discharge of their duties.

24 "§8-16-7.

"(a) When not otherwise provided by law, the
Commissioner of Agriculture and Industries within the state,
the county sealer within the county and the city sealer within

1 the city shall have the power and it shall be their duty to 2 inspect, test, try, and ascertain if they are correct all weights, measures, and weighing or measuring devices kept, 3 4 offered, or exposed for sale, sold, used, or employed in proving the size, quantity, extent, area, or measurement of 5 6 quantities, things, produce, or articles for distribution or 7 consumption purchased or offered or submitted for sale, hire, or reward, in computing any charge for services rendered on 8 the basis of weight or measure or in determining weight or 9 10 measure when a charge is made for such determination.

"(b) They shall have the power to, and shall from time to time, weigh or measure and inspect packages or amounts of commodities of whatsoever kind kept for the purpose of sale, offered, or exposed for sale, sold, or in the process of delivery in order to determine whether the same contain the amount represented and whether they are offered for sale or sold in a manner in accordance with the law.

18 "(c) They shall, at least once each year and as much 19 oftener as they may deem necessary, see that all weights, 20 measures, and weighing or measuring devices used are correct.

"(d) They may, for the purpose above mentioned and in the general performance of their official duties, at any reasonable time, may enter and go into or upon, without formal warrant, any stand, place, building, or premises or stop any vendor, peddler, junk dealer, coal wagon, ice wagon, delivery wagon, or any person whatsoever and require him <u>or her</u>, if

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necessary, to proceed to some place which the local sealer may
 specify for the purpose of making the proper test.

3 "(e) The commissioner may perform such testing of
4 weighing or measuring devices through a registered service
5 agent. The commissioner's duty to inspect and test weighing or
6 measuring devices used for commercial transaction is fulfilled
7 by the registered service agent's inspection and test for
8 accuracy.

9 "(f) A registered service agent shall perform the 10 inspection and test of weighing and measuring devices in accordance with the rules promulgated by the Board of 11 12 Agriculture and Industries. The registered service agent who performs the recalibration or repair may be, but is not 13 14 required to be, the same registered service agent who 15 performed the inspection. The registered service agent who performs the inspection and test of weighing and measuring 16 17 devices may be an agent or employee of the owner or an affiliate of the owner of the weighing and measuring devices. 18 "(q) The Department of Agriculture and Industries 19 shall approve a decal and upon approval, the department shall 20 21 provide a decal to registered service agents. After the device 22 meets all requirements as promulgated by the Board of 23 Agriculture and Industries the registered service agent shall 24 place an approved decal conspicuously on the weighing or 25 measuring device. "(h) The registered service agent shall provide all 26

27 <u>inspection and test reports of the weighing or measuring</u>

1	devices to the commissioner. The commissioner may adopt a
2	uniform reporting system to be utilized by all registered
3	services.
4	" <u>(i) The commissioner may adopt a system to</u>
5	periodically monitor, inspect, or test such weighing or
6	measuring devices to check the accuracy of the work of the
7	registered service agent.
8	"(j) The power conferred on the commissioner in
9	subsection (d) above shall not apply to a registered service
10	agent.
11	"(k) Beginning October 1, 2013, the commissioner may
12	suspend or revoke the certificate of registration of a
13	registered service agent for violating any provisions of this
14	<u>article.</u>
15	"(1) If the certificate of registration of a
16	registered service agent has been suspended or revoked, then
17	the service agent may not register with the department as a
18	service agent for at least one year.
19	" <del>(e)</del> <u>(m)</u> Whenever the Commissioner of Agriculture or
20	Industries or a local sealer of weights and measures finds a
21	violation of the statutes relating to weights and measures, he
22	or she shall cause the violator to be prosecuted.
23	"(n) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section,
24	the testing, inspection, and examination of all weights,
25	measures, and weighing or measuring devices is subject to the
26	oversight authority of the commissioner as set forth
27	hereinabove.

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"§8-16-18.

"(a) Any person violating any provision of this
chapter or the rules and regulations issued hereunder shall be
guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, unless otherwise
provided in this chapter, shall be fined not more than \$500
and may also be sentenced to hard labor for not more than six
months.

"(b) In addition to the criminal penalty provided 8 for in subsection (a), the Board of Agriculture and Industries 9 10 may adopt a schedule of civil fines for violations of this 11 chapter. All fines collected under this chapter shall be deposited into the Agricultural Fund in the State Treasury." 12 13 Section 2. This act shall become effective following 14 its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise 15 becoming law.
