16	Relating to state holidays; to amend Section 1-3-8,
17	Code of Alabama 1975, to remove Confederate Memorial Day as a
18	state holiday; and to delete duplicative language and make
19	nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the existing
20	code language to current style.
21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
22	Section 1. Section 1-3-8, Code of Alabama 1975, is
23	amended to read as follows:
24	" §1-3-8
25	(a) The following days are official state holidays:
26	Sunday, Christmas Day,
27	(1) New Year's Day, <u>January 1.</u>
28	(2) Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday, Robert E. Lee's

29 birthday, the third Monday in January.



30	(3) George Washington's birthday and Thomas
31	Jefferson's birthday, Confederate Memorial Day, National the
32	third Monday in February.
33	(4) Memorial Day, the last Monday in May.
34	(5) Jefferson Davis' birthday, the first Monday in
35	June.
36	(6) The Fourth day of July, July 4.
37	(7) Labor Day, the first Monday in September.
38	(8) Columbus Day, and Fraternal Day, and American
39	Indian Heritage Day, the second Monday in October.

45	(b) If any holiday falls on Sunday, the following day
46	is the holiday. If any holiday falls on Saturday, the
47	preceding day is the holiday.
48	(c) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (f), all
49	state holidays shall be observed by the closing of all state
50	offices. In addition, Veterans' Day shall be observed by the
51	closing of all state, county, and municipal offices, all banks
52	located within this state, and the all public K-12 schools, or
53	such day. Public schools, grades K to 12, inclusive, and all
54	public two-year institutions of higher education shall also be
55	closed on National Memorial Day, and such closing shall be
56	applicable to all students and non-essential employeesand

57	Memorial Day shall be observed by the closing of all public
58	K-12 schools and all public two-year and four-year
59	institutions of higher education.
60	(d) The Superintendent of Banks, with the concurrence
61	of not less than two members of the state Banking Board, may
62	authorize anythe closure of state bank to close on National
63	Memorial Day, the last Monday in May, banks in observance of
64	any state or federal holiday and on such any other days day as
65	may be declared by the Governor to be <u>a</u> state <u>holidays</u> holiday
66	or by the President of the United States to be a federal
67	<pre>holiday in honor of a special event. If any authorizeda state</pre>
68	holiday falls on Friday, the Superintendent of Banks may
69	authorize the Saturday following that Friday to be a holiday.
70	The superintendent may also authorize the closing of banks at
71	12:00 noon on the day prior to Christmas Day, and the day
72	prior to New Year's Day, if such days the holidays fall on
73	business days.
74	(b) Of the above enumerated legal public holidays, the
75	following shall be observed on the dates herein prescribed:
76	(1) Robert E. Lee's birthday - the third Monday in
77	January.
78	(2) George Washington's birthday - the third Monday in
79	February.
80	(3) Confederate Memorial Day - the fourth Monday in
81	April.
82	(4) Jefferson Davis' birthday - the first Monday in
83	June.
84	(5) Columbus Day and Fraternal Day - the second Monday



85	in October.
86	(6) Veterans' Day - the eleventh day of November.
87	(7) Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday - the third
88	Monday in January.
89	(8) National Memorial Day - the last Monday in May.
90	(9) Thomas Jefferson's birthday - the third Monday in
91	February.
92	(10) American Indian Heritage Day - the second Monday
93	in October.
94	(c) (e) (1) In addition to the legal state holidays
95	provided above in subsection (a), Mardi Gras shall be deemed a
96	holiday in Mobile and Baldwin Counties and all state offices
97	shall be closed in those counties on Mardi Gras.
98	(d) (2) In addition to the legal holidays provided above
99	allAll state employees, exceptother than those employed in
100	Baldwin and Mobile Counties, shall be granted one personal
101	leave day per year. The personal leave day shall be granted on
102	January 1 of each year. All state employees employed in
103	Baldwin and Mobile Counties shall be granted no personal leave
104	day. All-such personal leave days granted in any year <u>pursuant</u>
105	to this subdivision shall be used by the end of the calendar
106	year. All such personal leave days shall and must be scheduled
107	during the year with the approval of the supervisor.
108	Supervisors failing to schedule personal leave days for
109	employees shall justify that action in writing to the Director
110	of State Personnel and the employee shall receive pay at a
111	rate not less than the employee's usual and customary rate of
112	pay for any personal leave day not taken by December 31 of



113 each year.

(e) (f) (1) All state holidays shall be observed by the closing of all state offices. Any state office may remain open on a state holiday upon written notice by the appointing authority to the State Personnel Board at least 60 days in advance of the holiday. Provided, that In addition, any state office may be opened in the event of an emergency, and the State Personnel Board may grant a blanket approval for the openings opening of state offices needing to be open on holidays on a regular basis for essential services.

(2) Any state employee working on a state holiday shall receive a day of compensatory leave or paid compensation in lieu of the holiday as provided herein.

compensatory leave day provided in lieu of a regularly scheduled holiday, subject to the approval of the his or her supervisor, during the quarter that the regularly scheduled holiday occurred. If any compensatory leave day cannot be scheduled during the designated quarter, the compensatory leave day may be accumulated at the request of the employee for up to one year. Supervisors failing to schedule compensatory leave days for employees within the quarter, unless the day is carried forward at the request of the employee, shall justify that action in writing to the Director of State Personnel, and the employee shall receive pay at a rate not less than the employee's usual and customary rate of pay for any compensatory leave day to which the employee may be entitled and which has not been taken.



141	(g)(1) The first day in December of each year is
142	designated as Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day in this state. All
143	citizens of this state are requested to devote some portion of
144	Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day to commemorate the accomplishments of
145	Mrs. Rosa L. Parks, a woman of great courage, vision, love,
146	and faith who helped usher in the modern civil rights movement
147	on December 1, 1955, by refusing to give up her seat on a bus
148	in Montgomery, Alabama. Each resident of this state is
149	requested to observe the day with appropriate activities.
150	(2) Each county and municipality may elect to observe
151	Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day as a holiday."
152	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first
153	day of the third month following its passage and approval by
154	the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
