Section 1. (a) A public K-12 school may not 1 2 participate in, sponsor, or provide coaching staff for interscholastic athletic events that are either scheduled by 3 or conducted under the authority of any athletic association 4 that permits or allows participation in athletic events conducted exclusively for males by any individual who is not a 7 biological male as indicated on a birth certificate or participation in athletic events conducted exclusively for females by any individual who is not a biological female as indicated on a birth certificate.

(b) This section does not apply to athletic events at which both biological males and biological females are permitted or allowed to participate.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
