23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:	
24	Section 1. As used in this act, the following terms	
25	shall have the following meanings:	
26	(1) APPLIED BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS (ABA). The design,	

implementation, and evaluation of environmental modifications,

including the use of direct observation, measurement, and
functional analysis of the relationships between environment
and behavior, to produce socially significant improvement in
human behavior, performed by individuals licensed by the
Alabama Behavior Analyst Licensing Board pursuant to Chapter
5A of Title 34, Code of Alabama 1975.

- (2) AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER. A neurodevelopmental disorder as defined in the most recent edition of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders of the American Psychiatric Association.
  - (3) CHILD OR CHILDREN. Children between the ages of birth and 9 years of age.
- (4) DIAGNOSIS OF AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER. Medically necessary assessments, evaluations, or tests utilized to diagnose whether an individual has an autism spectrum disorder.
  - Section 2. The Department of Mental Health shall establish, administer, and operate an ABA program that provides ABA intervention services to children diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder in accordance with this act. The department shall do all of the following:
  - (1) Establish criteria and administer such programs and services as may be necessary for the operation of the ABA program.
  - (2) Provide ABA intervention services to children with autism spectrum disorder, excluding those children

- otherwise covered for ABA intervention services by public or private insurance.
  - (3) Receive any funds appropriated from the Legislature for the establishment, administration, and operation of the ABA program.

- (4) Issue annual reports to the Governor and the Legislature concerning the administration and operation of the ABA program.
- (5) Provide leadership for enhancement of ABA intervention in this state by aggressively establishing a unified approach to the state's efforts toward providing ABA intervention services to children in Alabama upon diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder, including, but not limited to, implementing specific strategies to effectively diagnose children with autism spectrum disorder at an early age and begin providing ABA intervention services as quickly as possible.
- (6) Promulgate rules and establish procedures to carry out the provisions of this act.

Section 3. The State Department of Education and the Department of Early Childhood Education shall identify children who have been diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder and refer those children to the Department of Mental Health for ABA intervention services under this act.

Section 4. The ABA program may not expend more than forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) annually per child for ABA intervention services under this act.

Section 5. There is hereby appropriated three million dollars (\$3,000,000) from the Education Trust Fund to the Department of Mental Health for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, to establish the ABA program and provide ABA intervention services to eligible children in the state.

Section 6. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
