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8	Relating to dental education; to amend Sections
9	16-47-76, 16-47-77, 16-47-78, 16-47-79, 16-47-80, and
10	16-47-81, Code of Alabama 1975; to rename and revise the
11	powers, duties, and membership of the Board of Dental
12	Scholarship Awards; to authorize the board to make loans to
13	dental students; and to provide for repayment of the loans.
14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
15	Section 1. Sections 16-47-76, 16-47-77, 16-47-78,
16	16-47-79, $16-47-80$, and $16-47-81$, Code of Alabama 1975, are
17	amended to read as follows:
18	"§16-47-76.
19	"(a) There is hereby created and established a board
20	to be known as the Board of Dental Scholarship and Loan
21	Awards, which shall be authorized and required to establish
22	scholarships <u>and loans</u> to provide for and further dental
23	education and training, in pursuance of a dental degree, of
24	qualified applicants for admission to the University of
25	Alabama School of Dentistry or any other dental school
26	accredited by the Council on Dental Education of the American
27	Dental Association. The board shall give first priority to

1	Alabama students residents who will attend dental school in
2	Alabama. In no event shall awards to students attending
3	out-of-state dental schools exceed the amount of awards
4	available to students attending the University of Alabama
5	School of Dentistry.
6	"(b) The board also shall establish the Alabama
7	Dental Service Program as set out in Sections 16-47-77 through
8	16-47-81.
9	"(c) The board shall also establish the Alabama
10	Rural Dental Health Scholars Program for the purpose of
11	awarding scholarships to high school students who are
12	interested in the practice of dentistry in rural areas. Also,
13	the board shall establish the Rural Dental Scholars Program
14	for dental students and shall award scholarships and
15	reimbursements for expenses for such dental students.
16	"(d) The board shall promulgate adopt rules for the
17	implementation and administration of the programs.
18	"(e) The board shall be composed of all of the
19	<pre>following members:</pre>
20	"(1) the Secretary A member of the Alabama Dental
21	Association, who shall serve as chairman of the board;
22	appointed by the board of the Alabama Dental Association.
23	"(2) one One dentist elected from each component

society of the Alabama Dental Association, whose terms of office shall be staggered, two dentists being elected for a term of one year, two dentists being elected for a term of two years, two dentists being elected for a term of three years,

1	and two dentists being elected for a term of four years, and
2	at the end of each term of office, successors shall be elected
3	for a term of four years 7.
4	"(3) the <u>The</u> Director of the Bureau of Dental <u>Office</u>
5	of Oral Health of the Alabama Department of Public Health
6	Department of Alabama; .
7	" $\underline{(4)}$ the $\underline{\text{The}}$ Dean of the University of Alabama
8	School of Dentistry or his <u>or her</u> designee ;.
9	"(5) and the The Chairman of the University of
10	Alabama School of Dentistry Admissions Committee.
11	"(f) The membership of the board shall be inclusive
12	and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and
13	economic diversity of the state. The board shall annually
14	report to the Legislature, by the second legislative day of
15	each regular session, the extent to which the board has
16	complied with the diversity requirements of this subsection.
17	"(f) (g) Annually, the board shall elect a chair
18	from among its members. Fifty percent of the members of the
19	board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of
20	business at meetings.
21	" (g) <u>(h) Members of the board may participate in a</u>
22	meeting of the board by means of telephone conference, video
23	conference, or similar communications equipment by means of
24	which all persons participating in the meeting may hear each
25	other at the same time. Participation by these means shall
26	constitute presence in person at a meeting for all purposes,

including constituting a quorum.

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"(a) The Board of Dental Scholarship awards and Loan

Awards shall have power and authority to make may adopt

reasonable rules and regulations not inconsistent with the

laws of this state as may be necessary for the regulation of

its proceedings and for the discharge of the duties imposed on

it.

"(b) The board shall receive and review all applications for scholarship loans and awards, and for loans awarded under the Alabama Dental Service Program, scholarships and loans, shall make a careful and thorough investigation of the ability, character, and qualifications of each applicant, and shall be responsible for the further administration of the scholarship loans and awards and of the program scholarships and loans, subject to the provisions of this article. Also, the board annually shall report on the condition and accomplishments of the program to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House, President Pro-Tem of the Senate and the chairs of the House and Senate health committees. The report shall include for the reporting year the locations where participants agreed to serve, or where dentists were serving, to repay program loans. The report also shall include for the reporting year the number of participating dentists who demonstrated to the board's satisfaction that an average of at least 20 percent of his or her active patients were indigent or covered by Medicaid, and the number of participating dentists who demonstrated to the

Τ	board's sacisfaction that an average of at least 30 percent of
2	his or her active patients were indigent or covered by
3	Medicaid.
4	"(c) The board shall annually calculate by
5	geographic area a Dental Shortage Index by dividing the number
6	of practicing dentists needed to meet the minimum number
7	according to the federal standard used to determine Dental
8	Health Care Professional Shortage Areas by the recommended
9	minimum number of dentists for that geographic area.
10	"(d)(1) Annually on or before the first day of
11	December, the board shall file a report on the condition,
12	performance, and accomplishments of the awards programs to the
13	Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House of
14	Representatives, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the
15	chairs of the House and Senate Health Committees, the chairs
16	of the Senate Committee on Finance and Taxation-Education and
17	the House Ways and Means-Education Committee, the Deputy
18	Director of the Legislative Services Agency-Fiscal Division,
19	and the Finance Director.
20	"(2) The board shall work with the Alabama
21	Commission on the Evaluation of Services to develop, track,
22	and collect the data and information necessary for the report.
23	"(e) Any appropriation made to the Board of Dental
24	Scholarship and Loan Awards or otherwise received by the board
25	remaining at the end of any fiscal year shall remain with the
26	board and shall not revert to any other fund.
27	"§16-47-78.

"(a) The board shall establish four two types of scholarships awards as follows:

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"(1) A number of loans equal to 20 percent of the number of students enrolled in the University of Alabama School of Dentistry, based on the economic need and scholastic ability of the applicant, in an amount not to exceed the annual tuition per annum or four times that amount over a four-year period, shall be available to any bona fide resident of Alabama of good character who has been accepted for matriculation by the University of Alabama School of Dentistry or any other educational institution accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association. This section shall also apply to graduate students at the discretion of the board.

"(2) A number of nonrefundable merit scholarship
awards equal in number to five percent of the number of
students enrolled in the University of Alabama School of
Dentistry, in an amount not to exceed the annual tuition per
annum or four times that amount over a four-year period, shall
be available to outstanding students, one fourth of which
shall be awarded each year to members of the entering class at
the University of Alabama School of Dentistry, who, in the
judgment of the board, have the highest scholastic achievement
in undergraduate studies, sufficient dental aptitude,
excellence of character, and other pertinent qualifications.

"(3) (1) A number of loans or nonrefundable scholarships for the Alabama Rural Dental Health Scholars

Program established pursuant to Section 16-47-76 and operated by the College of Community Health Sciences at the University of Alabama and supported by the University of Alabama School of Dentistry.

"(4) A number of scholarships and reimbursements for expenses for dental students in the Rural Dental Scholars

Program established pursuant to Section 16-47-76.

"(b) Any appropriations made pursuant to Sections

16-47-76 through 16-47-81, or funds received by the Board of

Dental Scholarship Awards remaining at the end of any fiscal

year shall remain with the board and not revert to any other

fund. This section shall have retroactive effect to September

30, 2005.

"(c) (1)(2) The board shall operate the Alabama

Dental Service Program, under which loans may be awarded by
the board to applicants of good character who are enrolled in
the University of Alabama School of Dentistry or any other
educational institution accredited by the Commission on Dental
Accreditation of the American Dental Association or have
recently completed a dental education or residency program,
but only to applicants who have agreed in writing to a
contract as provided in subsection (d) of Section 16-47-79.

Loans awarded under the program shall be based in part on the
economic need and scholastic ability of each applicant. For
applicants it approves to participate in the program, the
board may award each participant, for as many as four years,
an annual a loan worth up to the annual cost of four-year cost

of attendance based on in-state tuition and required fees at the University of Alabama School of Dentistry.

"(2) The program shall be funded by direct appropriation from the Education Trust Fund.

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"(b) The board may continue to make scholarship and loan awards in the same amount and under the same terms to any recipient who received a scholarship or loan from the board prior to the effective date of the act adding this subsection.

"(a) Scholarships extended under subdivisions (1) and (3) of subsection (a) of Section 16-47-78 shall be repaid following graduation either in cash as is provided under subsection (b) or under the terms of a contract to serve in a needy area in Alabama for a term to be specified by the board as provided in subsection (c). Any moneys received from recipients in repayment of a scholarship loan under subsections (b) and (c) shall upon receipt thereof be retained by the Board of Scholarship Awards to be used for funding of future scholarships. The board shall establish a separate fund for these purposes.

"(b) Scholarship loans to be repaid under this subsection shall be repaid to the Board of Dental Scholarship Awards in full at an interest rate of six percent per annum from the date of graduation from dental school. Payments are to be made annually, the first of which is due one year after the recipient enters the practice of dentistry or one year after after completion of specialty training, whichever occurs

first. Repayment in full shall be completed within eight years from initiation of repayment. Any recipient who fails for any reason to continue his or her dental education shall repay all loan amounts in accordance with terms and conditions established by the Board of Dental Scholarship Awards. The interest rate on such unpaid loan amounts shall be fixed at six percent per annum from date of his or her departure or removal from dental school.

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"(c) Scholarship loans to be repaid under this subsection shall be repaid by service in one of the following ways, subject to approval of the Board of Dental Scholarship Awards:

"(1) Practice for a four-year period in a community of less than 5,000 population in which the dentist-population ratio is less than one to 3,000 and the community is at least 30 miles from a city of 50,000 population. This mileage requirement may be waived by the board in its discretion in individual cases.

"(2) Practice for a five-year period in a community of more than 5,000 population and less than 15,000 population which has been deemed by the Board of Dental Scholarship Awards to be critically in need of additional dental practitioners.

"(3) Practice for a five-year period in a community of more than 15,000 but less than 100,000 population which has been deemed by the Board of Dental Scholarship Awards to be critically in need of additional dental practitioners, and

repayment of one half the loan plus six percent interest per annum in five annual payments, beginning at the end of the first year of practice.

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"(4) Practice for five years in a position in

Alabama in public health or as a dentist in a state

institution approved by the Board of Dental Scholarship

Awards.

"(5) For loans of less than four years of study, the annual tuition service repayment may be prorated for each year tuition is received.

"(6) Recipients who elect a service-type repayment pursuant to one of the preceding subdivisions (1), (2), (3), or (4) shall make repayment in cash plus six percent interest per annum on a prorated basis as determined by the Board of Dental Scholarship Awards for any portion of this obligation which is not fulfilled.

"(d)(1)(a) As a condition of approval by the board of a loan or loans under the Alabama Dental Service Program, each applicant shall enter into a written contract with the board, whereby the applicant shall agree to repay each annual loan received under the program by working, in full-time clinical practice as a licensed dentist in an area of critical need approved by the board, for 18 months, or 15 months if the dentist demonstrated to the board's satisfaction that an average of at least 20 percent of his or her active patients were indigent or covered by Medicaid during that time, or 12 months if the dentist demonstrated to the board's satisfaction

that an average of at least 30 percent of his or her active patients were indigent or covered by Medicaid during that time for five years. Each dentist repaying loans from the program by working in an area of critical need shall participate in the state Medicaid program.

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"An applicant who has signed such a contract with the board may postpone choosing an area of critical need in which to work to a time set by the board.

"(2) A participant in the program, subject to approval by the board, may change the area of critical need where he or she will work to repay loans under this program, but in no case shall the participant work in full-time practice for less than four years in the new area of critical need.

"(3) An area of critical need shall be an area in Alabama with a critical need, as determined by the board, for dentists, and shall not be a part of, or within five miles of, an urbanized area as defined most recently by the U.S. Census Bureau. The board shall adopt rules under the Administrative Procedure Act to implement this section.

"(4) Each dentist repaying loans from the program by working in an area of critical need shall participate in the state Medicaid program.

"(b) If the participant can demonstrate to the board's satisfaction that at least 30 percent of the participant's active patients were indigent or covered by

1	Medicaid during the previous year, the participant shall	
2	receive an additional three months of service credit.	
3	"(c) Subject to approval by the board, a participant	
4	in the program may change the area of critical need where he	
5	or she will work to repay loans under the program, but in no	
6	case shall the participant work in full-time practice for less	
7	than four years in the new area of critical need.	
8	"(d)(1) An area of critical need shall be an area in	
9	Alabama with a rate above 49 percent under the most recent	
10	Dental Shortage Index. The board may also consider the	
11	percentage of practicing dentists in a geographic area that	
12	are over the age of 65 in determining an area of critical	
13	need.	
14	"(2) In no event shall a shortage area be considered	
15	an area of critical need unless it is determined to be a	
16	shortage area pursuant to the most recent Dental Shortage	
17	Index or is one of the top 40 percent of geographic areas most	
18	in need of a dentist as determined by the board.	
19	"(e) The board may allow a participant in the	
20	Alabama Dental Service Program to serve part time in an area	
21	of critical need that is one of the top eight percent of areas	
22	most in need of a dentist under the most recent Dental	
23	Shortage Index. The participant must spend an average of 20	
24	hours a week on an annual basis practicing direct patient care	
25	in the designated county for a minimum of five years to	
26	qualify for full forgiveness of the loan.	
27	"\$16-47-80.	

"(a) Each recipient of a scholarship loan under the provisions of this article shall enter into a contract with the Board of Dental Scholarship and Loan Awards whereby he or she agrees to repay the scholarship loan in a manner prescribed by the board not inconsistent with any provision of this article. Breach of contract by the recipient shall make him or her the recipient immediately liable for the unpaid balance of the loan and shall constitute a ground for the revocation of his or her the recipient's certificate or license to practice dentistry in the State of Alabama. In the event of death or total and permanent disability of the recipient to engage in the practice of dentistry, repayment of the loan may be excused by the board.

"(b) The contract shall provide that if a breach of contract occurs prior to completion of the repayment obligations set forth in this article, a penalty equal to 100 percent of the remaining principal amount of all loans received by the recipient shall be assessed.

"(c) The Attorney General of Alabama, upon request of the Board of Dental Scholarship and Loan Awards, shall institute proceedings in the name of the state for the purpose of recovering any amount due the state under the provisions of this article. All proceedings involving default or dispute of the contract shall be brought in the appropriate court of jurisdiction in Montgomery County, Alabama. The proceedings to have such the dentist's certificate or license revoked shall be commenced upon the written complaint of the Board of Dental

1	Scholarship <u>and Loan</u> Awards to the State Board of Dental
2	Examiners. The proceedings shall be in accordance with the
3	provisions of Alabama law pertaining to the revocation of
4	licenses to practice dentistry. Notwithstanding any other
5	provision of this section, applicants and participants in the
6	Alabama Dental Service Program shall repay loans as called for
7	in written contracts outlined in subsection 16-47-79(d)
8	<u>Section 16-47-79</u> .
9	"(b) In addition to penalties for breach of contract
10	outlined above in this section, participants in the program
11	shall pay an additional penalty for breach of contract as
12	specified:
13	"(1) For breach of contract under which a year's
14	worth of loans has been received, a penalty equal to 20
15	percent of the total principal amount of the loan.
16	"(2) For breach of contract under which two years'
17	worth of loans have been received, a penalty equal to 30
18	percent of the total principal amount of the loan.
19	"(3) For breach of contract under which three years'
20	worth of loans have been received, a penalty equal to 40
21	percent of the total principal amount of the loan.
22	"(4) For breach of contract under which four years'
23	worth of loans have been received, a penalty equal to 50
24	percent of the total principal amount of the loan.
25	"(5) If breach of contract occurs after graduation
26	from dental school but prior to completion of the repayment
27	obligation set forth in Section 16-47-79(d), a penalty equal

to 100 percent of the total principal amount of all loans received by the participant from the program.

"\$16-47-81.

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"Any incorporated or unincorporated municipality or locality in the state having a population of less than 100,000 desiring additional dentists and wishing to be designated as a locality needing additional dentists may apply to the Board of Dental Scholarship and Loan Awards to be placed on a list of localities in need of additional dentists, which shall be maintained by the board. Such The application may be made either by the municipal governing body or by a petition signed by at least one twentieth of the qualified electors of the municipality or locality. If the Board of Dental Scholarship and Loan Awards determines that such the locality is in need of dentists, it shall place the locality on the list of localities in need of dentists from which recipients of scholarships may upon graduation select an area in which to practice. In compiling and maintaining the list, the board may place any locality thereon which, in its opinion, needs additional dentists. A locality on the list shall qualify as a place where participants in the Alabama Dental Service Program may work to repay loans awarded by the program only if the locality also is defined as an area of critical need as outlined in subdivision 16-47-79(d)(3)."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
