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9 A BILL  
10 TO BE ENTITLED  
11 AN ACT  
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13 Relating to Sumter County; to amend Section 4 of Act  
14 83-480, 1983 Regular Session, (Acts 1983, p. 672), as last  
15 amended by Act 2015-274 of the 2015 Regular Session which  
16 distributes the proceeds of fees levied on operators of  
17 hazardous waste disposal sites in the county; to provide  
18 further for the distributions of the proceeds of the fees  
19 relating to the North Sumter Day Center.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

21 Section 1. Section 4 of Act 83-480, 1983 Regular  
22 Session, (Acts 1983, p. 672), as last amended by Act 2015-274  
23 of the 2015 Regular Session is hereby further amended to read  
24 as follows:

25 "Section 4. (a) The proceeds of the fees generated  
26 by this act and Section 22-30B-2, Code of Alabama 1975, shall  
27 first be distributed in monthly installments, as follows:

1               "(1) Four thousand six hundred seventy-five dollars  
2               (\$4,675) to the Hill Hospital (Bond Obligation).

3               "(2) Four thousand dollars (\$4,000) to the Sumter  
4               Industrial Board.

5               "(3) Four thousand dollars (\$4,000) to the Solid  
6               Waste Fund.

7               "(4) Four thousand dollars (\$4,000) to the City of  
8               Livingston to be used by the Fire and Rescue Department for  
9               training and equipment for response to hazardous material  
10              cleanup, containment, or disposal throughout the county. If  
11              other certified public hazardous material responders are  
12              established after the effective date of this act, the City of  
13              Livingston Fire and Rescue Department shall share the proceeds  
14              proportionately with other certified units based on the area  
15              or areas served.

16              "(5) Two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) to  
17              the North Sumter Day Center.

18              "(b) After the distributions are made pursuant to  
19              subsection (a), the Sumter County Commission shall distribute  
20              the remaining funds as follows:

21              "(1) Sumter County Commission -  
22              Unearmarked   30%

23              "(2) Sumter County Commission Gen-  
24              eral Fund, to be earmarked for the  
25              county legislative delegation of-                                 5%

1           "(c) (1) All recipients of funds pursuant to this  
2 section must be a nonprofit or governmental entity and must  
3 provide an annual financial report to the Chair of the Sumter  
4 County Commission and the Sumter County legislative  
5 delegation. The delegation may also adopt rules for and  
6 require the application of additional financial assurances of  
7 an entity, including the requirement of periodic audits of the  
8 entities.

9           "(2) If any nonprofit receiving payment pursuant to  
10 this section is dissolved or loses its nonprofit status, its  
11 distributive share shall be held in trust by the Sumter County  
12 Commission for up to one fiscal quarter and shall be  
13 redistributed by resolution to one or more nonprofit or  
14 governmental entities named in subsection (a) or (b)."

15           Section 2. This act shall become effective on the  
16 first day of the first month following its passage and  
17 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
