1 Enrolled, An Act,

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- 4 Relating to the State Board of Health and emergency
- 5 medical services; to amend Section 22-18-1, Code of Alabama
- 6 1975, to further provide for the requirements for a licensure
- 7 as a community paramedic; and to prohibit the State Board of
- 8 Health from requiring a college degree for licensure as a
- 9 community paramedic.
- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- Section 1. Section 22-18-1 of the Code of Alabama 1975,
- 12 is amended to read as follows:
- 13 **"**§22-18-1
- 14 For the purposes of this article, the following terms
- shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them by this
- 16 section:
- 17 (1) ADVANCED EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN. Any
- individual who is an emergency medical services personnel, is
- 19 18 years of age or older, and who satisfies all of the
- 20 following:
- 21 a. Has successfully completed the advanced emergency
- 22 medical technician course of instruction, or its equivalent,
- as approved by the board.
- 24 b. Has passed the state Advanced EMT examination, as
- 25 well as having met the requirements for becoming a licensed
- 26 emergency medical technician.
- c. Has been granted a license by the board.
- 28 (2) ADVANCED LIFE SUPPORT (ALS). The treatment of



potentially life-threatening medical emergencies through the
use of invasive medical techniques specified as advanced life
support techniques by the board, which ordinarily would be
performed or provided by licensed physicians, but which may be
performed by emergency medical service personnel during
emergencies under constraints specified by rule of the board.

- (3) AIR AMBULANCE. An aircraft that is intended to be used for and is maintained or operated for transportation to a medical care facility of persons who are sick or injured. For the purposes of this chapter, fixed-wing aircraft that do not conduct scene flights shall not be considered air ambulances.
- 40 (4) BASIC LIFE SUPPORT (BLS). Prehospital care
 41 involving non-invasive life support measures as specified by
 42 the board.
- 43 (5) BOARD or BOARD OF HEALTH. The State Board of Health.
 - (6) COMMUNITY PARAMEDIC. An individual who is an emergency medical services personnel, is 18 years of age or older, and who satisfies all of the following:
- 48 a. Is currently licensed as a paramedic.

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- b. Has at least two years of full-time service as a paramedic.
- 51 c. Has successfully completed a community paramedic
 52 training program and obtained a postsecondary or equivalent
 53 award from an accredited college or university a paramedic
 54 course of instruction approved by the board.
 - d. Has passed the state community paramedic examination and has met the requirements for becoming a licensed community



- 57 paramedic.
- e. Has been granted a license by the board.
- 59 (7) COMMUNITY PARAMEDICINE PROGRAM. The provision of
- 60 episodic care, patient evaluation, advice, and treatment
- directed at preventing or improving a particular medical
- 62 condition, within the scope of practice of the emergency
- 63 medical services personnel.
- (8) DEFINITIVE CARE FACILITY. A facility that has the
- capability to render care to conclusively manage a patient's
- 66 current medical condition. The term includes, but is not
- 67 limited to, urgent care facilities, family practice
- 68 facilities, doctor's offices, and emergency departments.
- 69 (9) DEPARTMENT. The Alabama Department of Public
- 70 Health.
- 71 (10) EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES (EMS). A system of
- 72 coordinated medical assistance and care provided by emergency
- 73 medical services personnel, including:
- 74 a. The transportation and medical care provided to sick
- 75 or injured individuals before arrival at a definitive care
- 76 facility.
- 77 b. Continuation of care within a definitive care
- 78 facility subject to the approval from that facility.
- 79 c. Integrated medical care with the oversight of a
- 80 medical director.
- 81 (11) EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL (EMSP). The
- 82 collective term used to refer to all recognized National
- 83 Highway Traffic Safety Administration levels of personnel
- licensed by the board, who have met all primary and renewal



- 85 educational requirements, and who provide emergency or
- 86 non-emergency medical services within the level of their scope
- of practice and in accordance with the applicable EMS Patient
- 88 Care Protocols.
- 89 (12) EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (EMT). An individual
- 90 who is an emergency medical services personnel, is 18 years of
- 91 age or older, and who satisfies all of the following:
- 92 a. Has successfully completed the basic emergency
- 93 medical technician course of instruction, or its equivalent,
- 94 as approved by the board.
- 95 b. Has passed the state EMT examination.
- 96 c. Has been granted a license by the board.
- 97 (13) EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN-INTERMEDIATE. An
- 98 individual who is an emergency medical services personnel, is
- 99 18 years of age or older, and who, prior to December 31, 2002,
- 100 satisfied all of the following:
- 101 a. Successfully completed the intermediate emergency
- 102 medical technician course of instruction, or its equivalent,
- as approved by the board.
- 104 b. Passed the state EMT Intermediate examination and
- 105 has met the requirements for becoming a licensed emergency
- 106 medical technician.
- 107 c. Was granted a license by the board.
- 108 (14) GROUND AMBULANCE. A motor vehicle that is intended
- 109 to be used for and is maintained or operated for
- 110 transportation to a medical care facility of individuals who
- 111 are sick or injured.
- 112 (15) NON-TRANSPORT VEHICLE. A vehicle operated with the



- intent to provide BLS or ALS stabilization on scene, but not intended to transport a patient to a medical care facility.
- 115 (16) PARAMEDIC. Any individual who is an emergency
 116 medical services personnel, is 18 years of age or older, and
 117 who has successfully completed the paramedic course of
 118 instruction, or its equivalent, as approved by the board, and
 119 passed the state paramedic examination, and who has been
 120 granted a license by the board. The board may not require a
 121 college degree for licensure as a community paramedic.
 - (17) PATIENT. An individual who receives or requests medical care, or for whom medical care is requested, because the individual is sick or injured.

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- 125 (18) PHYSICIAN. An individual licensed to practice
 126 medicine or osteopathy by the Medical Licensure Commission of
 127 Alabama.
- 128 (19) PROGRAM MEDICAL DIRECTOR. A physician who has

 129 completed the approved EMS Medical Director course and


 130 provides medical direction and oversight to emergency medical

 131 services personnel.
- 132 (20) PROVIDER SERVICE. An organization, whether public 133 or private, which provides transport or non-transport 134 emergency medical services.
- 135 (21) SCENE FLIGHT. The flight of an air ambulance to 136 the physical location of a sick or injured individual.
- 137 (22) TRANSPORT VEHICLE. An air or ground ambulance."

 138 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first

 139 day of the third month following its passage and approval by

 140 the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
