8	Relating to missing and endangered persons; to amend
9	Sections 26-19A-1, 26-19A-2, 26-19A-3, 26-19A-4, and 26-19A-5,
10	Code of Alabama 1975, to expand existing law to include
11	missing and endangered persons living with a mental or
12	physical disability who are at risk of bodily harm or death.
13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
14	Section 1. Sections 26-19A-1, 26-19A-2, 26-19A-3,
15	26-19A-4, and 26-19A-5, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to
16	read as follows:
17	"§26-19A-1.
18	"This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the
19	Missing Senior Citizen and Endangered Persons Alert Act.
20	"\$26-19A-2.
21	"The Missing Senior Citizen and Endangered Persons
22	Alert Act is enacted for the following purposes:
23	"(1) To provide a rapid response to missing or lost
24	senior citizens persons suffering from living with a mental
25	disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's disease,
26	dementia, or autism and are at risk of bodily harm or death or
27	nersons suffering from Alzheimer's disease or dementia

Т	(2) To gain the voluntary assistance of the
2	broadcast media to help locate missing senior citizens and
3	endangered persons.
4	"\$26-19A-3.
5	"When used in this chapter, the following words and
6	terms shall have the following meanings:
7	"(1) ACJIC. The Alabama Criminal Justice Information
8	Center.
9	" $\frac{(2)}{(1)}$ BROADCASTER. Any entity that is engaged in
10	the business of broadcasting video or audio programs, whether
11	through the public airwaves, by cable, by direct or indirect
12	satellite transmissions, or by any other means of
13	communication.
14	" $\frac{(3)}{(2)}$ DEPARTMENT. The Alabama State Law
15	Enforcement Agency.
16	" (4) <u>(3)</u> MISSING SENIOR CITIZEN <u>AND ENDANGERED</u>
17	PERSONS ALERT. A voluntary program entered into by the
18	department and other local and state law enforcement agencies
19	and the Alabama Association of Broadcasters and broadcasters
20	licensed to serve in the state, which provides that if the
21	department verifies that a senior citizen person suffering
22	from living with a mental disability, physical disability,
23	Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or autism is missing or lost
24	and in danger, a media alert is transmitted. The broadcasters
25	participating in the program then issue a distribute the media
26	alert.

"§26-19A-4.

"(a) A missing senior citizen and endangered persons

alert shall be activated by the department when a citizen

person is reported missing and an investigation reveals the

following:

- "(1) The citizen person is suffering from living with a mental disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or autism and is at risk of bodily harm or death, or suffers from Alzheimer's disease or dementia. An alert may be issued for a person suffering from Alzheimer's disease or dementia regardless of age.
- "(2) There is enough descriptive information about the senior or person suffering from living with Alzheimer's disease or dementia a mental disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or autism and at risk of bodily harm or death to believe an immediate media alert would help investigators locate the person. For persons suffering from living with Alzheimer's disease or dementia a mental disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or autism, a statement from a caregiver that the missing person suffers from lives with either disease a mental disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or autism shall be considered sufficient proof of the disease mental disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or autism.
- "(b) A report of a missing senior citizen or missing person suffering from Alzheimer's disease or dementia and endangered person may be made by a local law enforcement

agency to the department as soon as a concerned party or caregiver believes the person to be missing and the originating local law enforcement agency has entered identifying and descriptive information about the missing and endangered person to the Alabama Center for Missing and Exploited Children and to the National Crime Information

Center pursuant to Section 26-19-7. Upon the submission of the report, a search in the missing and endangered person's local area may begin immediately, and the department may expand the search to include areas outside of the missing and endangered person's local area if needed.

"(c) The department and local law enforcement agencies shall require law enforcement officers and other emergency personnel to complete first responder training for missing persons with Alzheimer's disease or other forms of dementia, if such training is available through the department, the Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission, or the free training and certification program offered by the Alzheimer's Association. If a missing and endangered person report is made for a person suffering from living with Alzheimer's disease or dementia, the department and local law enforcement agencies shall utilize, if available, personnel who have participated in this training to assist in conducting the search.

"\$26-19A-5.

1	"Once a determination has been made to activate the
2	missing senior citizen and endangered person media alert, the
3	originating agency department shall do the following:
4	"(1) Issue a local media alert via E-mail and fax
5	indicating that a senior citizen person suffering from living
6	with a mental disability, physical disability, Alzheimer's
7	disease, dementia, or autism is missing and believed to be in
8	danger.
9	"(2) Prepare and send via E-mail and fax the
10	information and description of the missing senior and
11	endangered person to the media in the appropriate area.
12	"(3) Supplement the information by descriptions or
13	photographs of the person to the media and the public through
14	the following:
15	"a. E-mail description.
16	"b. Post the missing senior's and endangered
17	person's photograph on the department's website.
18	"(4)a. Once the senior missing and endangered person
19	is found or the case is closed, the initiating law enforcement
20	agency shall notify the department which shall distribute a
21	media alert cancellation.
22	"b. Law enforcement officials shall notify other
23	agencies of the cancellation."
24	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the

first day of the third month following its passage and

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
