- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
- 8 Section 1. Section 13A-7-4.3, Code of Alabama 1975, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 "\$13A-7-4.3
- 11 (a) For the purposes of this section, the following
- 12 words have the following meanings:
- 13 (1) CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE. A system or asset, whether
- 14 physical or virtual, so vital to the <u>United States that the</u>
- incapacity or destruction of the system or asset would have a
- debilitating impact on security, national economic security,
- 17 national public health, or national public safety.
- 18 (1) (2) CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITY. The term
- 19 includes, but is not limited to, any of the following,
- 20 including any critical infrastructure located on or in any of
- 21 the following types of facilities:
- 22 a. a. A chemical, polymer, or rubber manufacturing
- 23 facility_{τ}.

- 68 (2)(3) FRAUDULENT DOCUMENTS FOR IDENTIFICATION
- 69 PURPOSES. A document which that is presented as being a bona
- 70 fide document that provides personal identification
- 71 information but which, in fact, is false, forged, altered, or
- 72 counterfeit.
- 73 $\frac{(3)}{(4)}$ PERSON. An individual, trust, estate,
- 74 corporation, partnership, limited partnership, limited
- 75 liability partnership, limited liability company, or
- 76 unincorporated nonprofit association having a separate legal
- 77 existence under state law.
- 78 (4)(5) UNMANNED AIRCRAFT SYSTEM. A powered, aerial
- 79 vehicle that does not carry a human operator, uses aerodynamic
- 80 forces to provide vehicle lift, may fly autonomously through
- 81 an onboard computer or be piloted remotely, and may be
- 82 expendable or recoverable. The term does not include a
- 83 satellite orbiting the Earth or a spacecraft beyond Earth's
- 84 atmosphere and may not be construed to implicate the provider



of a telecommunications link between an owner or operator of an unmanned aircraft system and the unmanned aircraft system.

- (b) A person commits the crime of unauthorized entry of a critical infrastructure <u>facility</u> if the person does any of the following:
- (1) Intentionally enters without authority into any structure or onto any premises belonging to another that constitutes in whole or in part a critical infrastructure facility that is completely enclosed by any type of physical barrier or clearly marked with a sign or signs that are posted in a conspicuous manner and indicate that unauthorized entry is forbidden.
- (2) Uses or attempts to use a fraudulent document for identification for the purpose of entering a critical infrastructure facility.
 - (3) Remains upon or on the premises of a critical infrastructure <u>facility</u> after having been forbidden to do so, either orally or in writing, by any owner, lessee, or custodian of the property or by any other authorized person.
 - (4) Intentionally enters into a restricted area of a critical infrastructure <u>facility</u> which is marked as a restricted or limited access area that is completely enclosed by any type of physical barrier when the person is not authorized to enter the restricted or limited access area.
- 109 (c) A person who commits the crime of unauthorized
 110 entry of a critical infrastructure <u>facility</u> is guilty of a
 111 Class A misdemeanor.
- 112 (d) If, during the commission of the crime of





- unauthorized entry of a critical infrastructure <u>facility</u>, the

 person injures, removes, destroys, or breaks critical

 infrastructure property, or otherwise interrupts or interferes

 with the operations of a critical infrastructure asset, the

 person is guilty of a Class C felony.
- 118 (e) A person who commits the crime of unauthorized
 119 entry of a critical infrastructure <u>facility</u> while possessing
 120 or operating an unmanned aircraft system with an attached
 121 weapon, firearm, explosive, destructive device, or ammunition
 122 is guilty of a Class C felony.
 - (f) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent lawful assembly and peaceful and orderly petition for the redress of grievances, including, but not limited to, any labor dispute between any employer and its employee.
- 127 (g) Nothing in this section shall be construed to

 128 prohibit the state, a county, or a municipality from taking

 129 any lawful action on their respective rights-of-way."

 130 Section 2. This act shall become effective on October
- 131 1, 2024.
