8 SYNOPSIS: Under existing law, certain veterans are
9 eligible for more categories of distinctive motor
10 vehicle tags designed for a specific branch of the
11 Armed Services or for a specific military honor.
12 Under existing law, many of these categories of
13 distinctive motor vehicle tags for military
14 veterans are available to the veterans at a reduced
15 cost.

16 This bill would authorize any veteran who is
17 eligible to receive a distinctive motor vehicle tag
18 designed for military veterans for use on a car or
19 truck to receive that distinctive motor vehicle tag
20 for a motorcycle, if the tag is available for
21 motorcycles, at the same cost.

24 TO BE ENTITLED

1 Relating to distinctive motor vehicle tags for
2 military veterans; to authorize a military veteran who is
3 eligible to receive a distinctive motor vehicle tag for
4 veterans for his or her car or truck to receive a motorcycle
5 tag, when available, at the same cost.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

7 Section 1. Any military veteran who is eligible to
8 receive at a reduced charge a distinctive motor vehicle
9 license tag for military veterans for a car or truck may
10 receive for the same cost a distinctive motorcycle tag, where
11 available for the same class or designation of veteran, at the
12 same cost as the distinctive license tag for a car or truck.

13 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
14 first day of the third month following its passage and
15 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
