1 Relating to distinctive motor vehicle tags for 2 military veterans; to authorize a military veteran who is 3 eligible to receive a distinctive motor vehicle tag for 4 veterans for his or her car or truck to receive a motorcycle 5 tag, when available, at the same cost.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Any military veteran who is eligible to receive at a reduced charge a distinctive motor vehicle license tag for military veterans for a car or truck may receive for the same cost a distinctive motorcycle tag, where available for the same class or designation of veteran, at the same cost as the distinctive license tag for a car or truck.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
