To amend Sections 11-43-144 and 36-30-5, Code of 1 2 Alabama 1975, relating to compensation for death or disability of firefighters from occupational diseases; to provide with 3 4 certain exceptions that there is no time limitation upon the filing of a claim for disability benefits or death benefits 5 6 payable to a firefighter or to his or her family; and to allow 7 a claimant who was previously denied benefits because the claim was submitted after he or she was no longer employed as 8 a firefighter by the city may resubmit claims for 9 10 consideration under the terms of this section as amended without regard to any time limitations otherwise provided. 11 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: Section 1. Sections 11-43-144 and 36-30-5 of the 13 14 Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows: "§11-43-144. 15 "(a) As used in this section the following words and 16 17 terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them herein unless a contrary meaning is indicated by the context: 18 19 "(1) CITY. Any municipality of the state, regardless 20 of its population. 21 "(2) FIREFIGHTER. A person employed as a firefighter 22 by a city. "(3) FIREFIGHTER'S OCCUPATIONAL DISEASE. Any 23 24 condition or impairment of health caused by any of the 25 following: 26 "a. Hypertension. 27 "b. Heart disease.

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"c. Respiratory disease.

2 "d. Cancer which manifests itself in a firefighter during the period in which the firefighter is in the service 3 4 of the city, provided the firefighter demonstrates that he or she was exposed, while in the employ of the city, to a known 5 6 carcinogen which is reasonably linked to the disabling cancer, 7 and the cancer shall be presumed to arise out of and in the course of the firefighter's employment unless the city 8 demonstrates by a preponderance of the evidence that the 9 10 cancer was caused by some other means.

"e. AIDS which manifests itself in a firefighter during the period in which the firefighter is in the service of the city, provided the firefighter demonstrates that he or she was exposed to AIDS while in the line and scope of his or her employment with the city.

16 "f. Hepatitis which manifests itself in a
17 firefighter during the period in which the firefighter is in
18 the service of the city, provided the firefighter demonstrates
19 that he or she was exposed to hepatitis while in the line and
20 scope of his or her employment with the city.

21 "(4) DISABILITY. Disability to perform duties as a 22 firefighter.

"(5) BENEFIT. Any monetary allowance payable by a city or from a pension system established for the firemen of a city to a firefighter on account of his or her disability or to his or her dependents on account of his or her death, irrespective of whether the same is payable under a pension
 law of the state or under some other law of the state.

3 "(b) This section shall apply to firefighters who,
4 upon entering the service of the city as firefighters, have
5 successfully passed a physical examination which failed to
6 reveal any evidence of a firefighter's occupational disease
7 and who have completed at least three years' service as
8 firefighters.

9 "If a physical examination was not required at the 10 time of entry into service, a firefighter who has completed at 11 least three years' continuous service as a firefighter next 12 preceding September 8, 1967, shall be deemed eligible for 13 benefits under this section.

"(c) If a firefighter who gualifies for benefits 14 15 under this section suffers disability as a result of a firefighter's occupational disease his or her disability shall 16 17 be compensable the same as any service-connected disability under any law which provides benefits for firefighters of the 18 city injured in the line of duty. If a firefighter who 19 qualifies for benefits under this section dies as the result 20 21 of a firefighter's occupational disease, his or her death 22 shall be compensable to the same extent as the death of a 23 firefighter killed in the line of duty, and shall be 24 considered to have been killed in the line of duty for purposes of Sections 36-30-1 to 36-30-7, inclusive. 25

26 "(d) In the case of cancer, heart disease,27 hypertension, and respiratory disease, the municipality must

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prove by a preponderance of the evidence that the condition was caused by some means other than the occupation to disgualify the firefighter from benefits.

4 "(e) There is no time limitation for filing a claim for disability benefits or death benefits payable to a 5 firefighter or to his or her family pursuant to this section. 6 7 If a claim is filed more than 10 years from the last day of employment as a firefighter by the city, subsection (d) does 8 not apply. If a claim is filed after 10 years, the firefighter 9 10 or family must produce evidence that the disability or death was proximately caused by the firefighter's occupational 11 12 disease during service as a firefighter under the provisions 13 of this section.

14 "(f) Any claimant who was previously denied benefits 15 because the claim was submitted after he or she was no longer 16 employed as a firefighter by the city may resubmit claims for 17 consideration under the terms of this section as amended 18 without regard to any time limitations otherwise provided. 19 "\$36-30-5.

20 "(a)(1) There is no time limitation for filing a claim for disability benefits or death benefits payable to a 21 22 firefighter or to his or her family pursuant to this section. 23 If a claim is filed more than 10 years from the last day of employment as a firefighter by the city, subsection (d) does 24 25 not apply. If a claim is filed after 10 years, the firefighter or family must produce evidence that the disability or death 26 27 was proximately caused by the firefighter's occupational

3 "(2) Any claimant who was previously denied benefits
4 because the claim was submitted after he or she was no longer
5 employed as a firefighter by the city may resubmit claims for
6 consideration under the terms of this section as amended
7 without regard to any time limitations otherwise provided.

"(a) All claims for compensation as provided in this 8 9 article shall be presented to the awarding authority within two years from the date of the death of the peace officer or 10 firefighter or the claims are forfeited. (b) All such claims 11 12 shall be presented in the form prescribed by the awarding 13 authority, and proof of the facts and circumstances of the 14 peace officer's or firefighter's death and, if necessary, the 15 claimant's relationship to and dependence upon such peace officer or firefighter shall be made in the manner prescribed 16 17 by the awarding authority.

"(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection 18 19 (a), any person who was previously ineligible to claim the 20 compensation provided in this article, but is now eligible to 21 claim the compensation provided in this article because of the 22 enactment of Act 2008-480, and who is making a claim based 23 upon the death of a peace officer or firefighter who died on 24 or after January 1, 2006, but prior to the enactment of Act 2008-480, shall be able to present his or her claim for 25 26 compensation to the awarding authority within one year of the 27 date of enactment of Act 2008-480 regardless of whether the

claim was presented within one year from the date of the death
 of the peace officer or firefighter.

3 "(c) The awarding authority is hereby authorized to
4 prescribe such forms and adopt such rules of evidence and
5 procedure as it deems necessary or proper, not inconsistent
6 with the provisions of this article, for the proper
7 determination of all claims for compensation under this
8 article."
