10 TO BE ENTITLED

13 Relating to Cherokee County; to provide for the
14 salary of the coroner; to provide for the appointment of a
15 deputy coroner and for the salary of the deputy coroner; and
16 to repeal certain prior acts.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

18 Section 1. Effective beginning the next term of
19 office of the coroner in January 2019, the annual salary of
20 the coroner shall be thirteen thousand five hundred dollars
21 (\$13,500) per year payable from the general fund of the
22 county.

23 Section 2. Effective beginning the next term of
24 office of the coroner in January 2019, the coroner may appoint
25 a qualified person to serve as deputy coroner to perform the
26 duties of the coroner when the coroner is unavailable or
27 absent or when the coroner is incapacitated. When called upon

1 to serve, the deputy coroner shall have the same legal
2 authority and responsibility as the coroner. The annual salary
3 of the deputy coroner shall be six thousand dollars (\$6,000)
4 per year payable from the general fund of the county.

5 Section 3. Act 609 of the 1957 Regular Session (Acts
6 1957, p. 1500), as amended by Act 507 of the 1963 Regular
7 Session (Acts 1963, p. 1094); Act 346 of the 1966 Special
8 Session (Acts 1966, p. 489), as amended by Act 855 of the 1971
9 Regular Session (Acts 1971, p. 1616); Act 80-358 of the 1980
10 Regular Session (Acts 1980, p. 478), now appearing as Section
11 45-10-60, Code of Alabama 1975; Act 93-490 of the 1993 Regular
12 Session (Acts 1993, p. 785) and Act 99-654 of the 1999 Regular
13 Session (Acts 1999, p. 109), now appearing as Section
14 45-10-60.01, Code of Alabama 1975; and Act 899 of the 1975
15 Regular Session (Acts 1975, p. 1760), are expressly repealed.

16 Section 4. This act shall become effective on the
17 next term of the coroner in January 2019, following its
18 passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise
19 becoming law.
