would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. If this bill is not enacted by a 2/3 vote, it will not become effective with regard to a local entity unless approved by the local entity or until, and only as long as, the Legislature appropriates funds or provides for a local source of revenue.

Relating to drinking water in public K-12 schools; to require the installation of drinking fountains, water coolers, or water bottle filling stations in certain public K-12 school buildings; and to regulate the use of drinking fountains, water coolers, water bottle filling stations, and water bottles by individuals in public K-12 schools; and in

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) (1) Notwithstanding any otherwise applicable state or local building or plumbing codes or state or local laws or regulations that specifically pertain to the number of required drinking fountains in a public K-12 school building, public K-12 school buildings shall contain a minimum of one drinking fountain, water cooler, or water bottle filling station per 100 individuals projected to occupy the building.

- (2) Drinking fountains, water coolers, or water bottle filling stations shall be placed in common areas, including, but not limited to:
 - a. Hallways.
 - b. Cafeterias.
- 21 c. Gymnasiums.

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- 22 d. Outdoor physical activity spaces.
- 23 e. Faculty lounges.
- 24 (b) Drinking fountains, water coolers, and water 25 bottle filling stations shall be accessible to all individuals, regardless of age, ability, or disability.

1 (c) Water bottle filling stations installed pursuant 2 to this section may be integrated into drinking fountains.

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- (d) A drinking fountain, water cooler, or water bottle filling station installed pursuant to this section shall dispense cooled and filtered drinking water and be regularly cleaned and maintained.
- (e) Water bottles shall be allowed for use by students, teachers, and staff of a public K-12 school, and shall meet all of the following criteria:
- (1) Be made of a material that is not easily breakable.
 - (2) Have a lid to prevent spills.
 - (3) Be used exclusively for water.
 - (f) Water bottles shall be allowed in classrooms of public K-12 schools, but may be excluded from libraries, computer labs, science labs, and other places where it may be deemed dangerous to have or consume drinking water.
 - (g) Public K-12 schools shall provide access to drinking water and cups or other drinking containers during mealtimes.
 - (h) Local boards of education may establish policies governing the use of water bottles pursuant to this section.

Section 2. The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended by Amendment 890, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the

Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended. If this bill is not enacted by a 2/3 vote, it will not become effective with regard to a local entity unless approved by the local entity or until, and only as long as, the Legislature appropriates funds or provides for a local source of revenue.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
