10 TO BE ENTITLED  
11 AN ACT  
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13 Relating to the City of Lincoln in Talladega County;  
14 to alter, rearrange, and extend the boundary lines and  
15 corporate limits of the city; and to further provide for the  
16 police jurisdiction of the city.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

18 Section 1. (a) The boundary lines and corporate  
19 limits of the City of Lincoln in Talladega County are altered,  
20 rearranged, and extended to include within the corporate  
21 limits of the municipality, in addition to the lands now  
22 included, all of the following territory:

23 Located in Section 28, Township 17 South, Range 4  
24 East, Talladega County, Alabama, being more particularly  
25 described as follows:

1                   Lots 4 and 5, Riverview Lane Subdivision, a plat of  
2 which is recorded in the Office of the Judge of Probate for  
3 Talladega County, Alabama, in Slide 229, at page 263.

4                   (b) The annexation by this section shall not affect  
5 or extend the police jurisdiction of the City of Lincoln.

6                   Section 2. This act is enacted pursuant to the  
7 plenary authority of the Legislature to alter or rearrange the  
8 boundaries of a city or town pursuant to subdivision (18) of  
9 Section 104 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901.

10                  Section 3. If any part of this act is declared  
11 invalid or unconstitutional, the annexation in subsection (a)  
12 of Section 1 shall be null and void.

13                  Section 4. In accordance with Section 11-42-6(b) of  
14 the Code of Alabama 1975, a map showing what territory is  
15 proposed to be annexed to the City of Lincoln is on file in  
16 the office of the Judge of Probate in Talladega County,  
17 Alabama, and the map is open to the inspection of the public.

18                  Section 5. This act shall become effective on the  
19 first day of the third month following its passage and  
20 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
