SYNOPSIS: This bill would propose an amendment to the 8 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to increase the 9 10 total amount of bonding authority granted under 11 Amendment 666 to the Constitution of Alabama of 12 1901, as amended; to provide for additional 13 payments from the Alabama Trust Fund to fund any 14 bonds issued; to provide for competitive bidding of 15 the bonds; to require the Bond Commission to contract with businesses or individuals which 16 17 reflect the racial and ethnic diversity of the 18 state; and to provide for the use of the proceeds 19 for plans, construction, and maintenance of Alabama 20 National Guard armories. 21 22 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 23 24 AN ACT 25 26 To propose an amendment to the Constitution of

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

11 Section 1. The following amendment to the 12 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and 13 shall become valid as a part thereof when approved by a 14 majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in 15 accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution 16 of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

(a) The authority granted to the State of Alabama to
become indebted and to sell and issue its interest-bearing
General Obligation bonds, in addition to all other bonds of
the state, under Amendment 666 to the Constitution of Alabama
of 1901, as amended, is hereby increased by an additional
amount of fifty million dollars (\$50,000,000).

(b) All of the bonds shall be sold only at public
sale or sales, either on sealed bids or at public auction,
after such advertisement as may be prescribed by the Bond
Commission, to the bidder whose bid reflects the lowest true

interest cost to the state computed to the respective maturities of the bonds sold; provided, that if no bid deemed acceptable by the commission is received all bids may be rejected.

5 (c) Relative to issuance expenses, contracts, and 6 appointments incurred in connection with the issuance of 7 bonds, the Bond Commission created in Section IX of Amendment 8 666 to the Constitution of 1901, shall contract with 9 businesses or individuals which reflect the racial and ethnic 10 diversity of the state.

(d) Bonds issued pursuant to this amendment shall be
issued for a maturity of 20 years or less.

(e) All of the proceeds from the bonds shall be
distributed to the Armory Commission of Alabama for plans,
construction, and maintenance of Alabama National Guard
armories.

17 (f) In addition to any Oil and Gas Capital Payments received by the Alabama Trust Fund paid into the Alabama 18 Capital Improvement Trust Fund pursuant to Amendment 666, so 19 20 much as shall be necessary of all Oil and Gas Capital Payments 21 received by the Alabama Trust Fund during any fiscal year 22 shall be paid into the Alabama Capital Improvement Trust Fund 23 to pay the principal and interest on the bonds authorized by 24 this amendment.

(g) In all other respects regarding the Alabama
Trust Fund, the terms and provisions of Amendment 666 and

Amendment 856 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as
 amended, are unchanged and remain in full force and effect.

3 Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment 4 shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the 5 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284 6 and 285 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 7 Alabama of 1901, as amended, and the election laws of this 8 state.

9 Section 3. The appropriate election official shall 10 assign a ballot number for the proposed constitutional 11 amendment on the election ballot and shall set forth the 12 following description of the substance or subject matter of 13 the proposed constitutional amendment:

14 "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of 15 Alabama of 1901, as amended, relating to the Capital Improvement Trust Fund, to increase the amount of the General 16 17 Obligation Bonds authorized herein; to provide for additional payments from the Alabama Trust Fund to fund any bond issued; 18 to provide for competitive bidding of the bonds; and to 19 provide for the distribution of the proceeds for plans, 20 21 construction, and maintenance of Alabama National Guard 22 armories.
