This bill would also authorize the State 16 17 Employees' Insurance Board to determine the years 18 of creditable service for such periods of time that 19 an employee of the USS Alabama Battleship 20 Commission was employed as a non-Merit System 21 employee. 22 This bill would provide for retroactive 23 effect. 24 25 A BILL 26 TO BE ENTITLED 27 AN ACT

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To amend Section 36-29-1, as amended by Act 2011-698 2 of the 2011 Regular Session (Acts 2011, p. 2141), Code of 3 4 Alabama 1975, relating to the State of Alabama; to add certain employees of the USS Alabama Battleship Commission to the 5 6 definition of retiree; to revise the definition of years of 7 service so as to authorize the State Employees' Insurance Board to determine the years of creditable service for such 8 9 periods of time that an employee of the USS Alabama Battleship 10 Commission was employed as a non-Merit System employee; and to provide for retroactive effect to July 1, 2008. 11 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: Section 1. Section 36-29-1, as amended by Act 13 14 2011-698 of the 2011 Regular Session (Acts 2011, p. 2141), 15 Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows: "§36-29-1. 16 17 "When used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the following meanings, respectively, unless the 18 context clearly indicates otherwise: 19 "(1) BOARD. The State Employees' Insurance Board. 20 21 "(2) CLASS. An employee or retiree shall be included 22 in one of the following classes: (i) active employee single, 23 (ii) active employee family, (iii) non-Medicare retiree 24 single, (iv) non-Medicare retiree family, (v) Medicare retiree 25 single, (vi) Medicare retiree family, (vii) non-Medicare retiree with Medicare eligible dependent(s), or (viii) 26 27 Medicare retiree with non-Medicare dependent(s).

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1 "(3) EMPLOYEE. A person who works full time for the 2 State of Alabama or for a county health department and who receives his or her full compensation on a monthly basis 3 4 through means of a state warrant drawn upon the State Treasury or by check drawn by the Treasurer of the Alabama State Port 5 6 Authority or by check drawn by the Treasurer of the USS 7 Alabama Battleship Commission or by check drawn by the treasurer of the Alabama state agency for surplus property 8 other than those employees covered by the federal Railroad 9 10 Retirement Act. Full-time employees of the county health department in all counties having populations of not less than 11 12 300,000 nor more than 500,000 shall also be included in the 13 definition of employee for the purpose of this chapter, and 14 the health department of any such county is hereby authorized 15 to pay the employer's share of any contributions to the retirement fund; provided further, that any district attorney 16 17 or full-time employees in the district attorney's office, of any judicial circuit shall be included in the definition of 18 employee for the purpose of this chapter, and the respective 19 judicial circuits are hereby authorized to pay the employer's 20 21 share of any contribution therefor and any person employed 22 part time by the State of Alabama on a wage and hourly basis, 23 excluding fee compensations and other like arrangements, shall 24 be included in the definition of employee as defined in this 25 chapter provided such person shall agree to have deducted from his or her hourly wage, as stipulated, a pro rata portion of 26 27 the premium cost of a full-time state employee based on the

1 percentage of time such person is employed by the state 2 according to rules and regulations established by the State Employees' Insurance Board. The term shall also include an 3 4 employee who worked at least 10 years for the State Department of Transportation in "captive county" circumstances as defined 5 by Section 23-1-100 and who was transferred to county 6 7 employment upon the adoption of Article 3A, Chapter 1, Title 23. Provided further, however, any costs incurred as a result 8 of including such employee in this term shall be payable from 9 10 funds of the State Department of Transportation.

11 "(4) EMPLOYEE CONTRIBUTION. The amount of the total 12 health insurance premium to be paid by the employee or retiree 13 as determined by the board.

14 "(5) EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTION. The amount of the total
15 health insurance premium to be paid by the employer as
16 determined by the board.

"(6) FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL. Income level determined in Section 673(2) of the Community Services Block Grant Act 2 (42 U.S.C. § 9902(2)). Should the federal government no longer derive or substantially change its derivation of the federal poverty level, the State Employees' Insurance Board has the authority to derive and apply an alternate poverty level to carry out its obligations under this chapter.

"(7) HEALTH INSURANCE PREMIUM. The total health
insurance cost under the State Employees' Health Insurance
Plan with respect to each class of employees or retirees.
Individual premiums may include adjustments and surcharges for

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(i) family size including, but not limited to, a husband and
wife both being covered by the State Employees' Health
Insurance Plan, (ii) spouse's eligibility for other health
insurance, (iii) smokers and users of tobacco products, (iv)
preventative care and wellness care participation, and (v) any
such other categories of risk that the board shall approve.

"(8) MEDICARE RETIREE. A retiree entitled to
benefits under the federal Medicare program (Subchapter XVIII
of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 1395 et seq.).

10 "(9) NON-MEDICARE RETIREE. A retiree not entitled to 11 benefits under the federal Medicare program (Subchapter XVIII 12 of the Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. §§ 1395 et seq.).

"(10) OTHER EMPLOYER GROUP HEALTH INSURANCE
COVERAGE. Group health insurance coverage available to an
employee or retiree through an employer other than the State
of Alabama. Other employer group health insurance coverage
does not include the State Employees' Health Insurance Plan,
the Public Education Employees' Health Insurance Plan, or the
local government health insurance plan.

"(11) RETIREE. An employee who retires from the service of the State of Alabama, who, at the time of such retirement has at least 10 years of creditable coverage, meets the criteria set out in this chapter and who, following such retirement, draws a monthly benefit from the Employees' Retirement System of Alabama, <u>the USS Alabama Battleship</u> Commission, the Judicial Retirement System of Alabama, the

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Teachers' Retirement System of Alabama, or the Alabama State
 Port Authority.

"(12) STATE EMPLOYEES' HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN. The 3 4 health benefit plan administered or offered by the State Employees' Insurance Board for eligible employees and retirees 5 6 and their respective dependents. The State Employees' 7 Insurance Board may offer supplemental coverages and policies in lieu of or in addition to coverage in the basic medical 8 plan of the State Employees' Health Insurance Plan. Also 9 10 referred to herein as "health insurance plan" or "plan."

"(13) SUPPLEMENTAL COVERAGE. Coverage offered to employees and retirees by the State Employees' Insurance Board in lieu of coverage in the basic medical plan of the State Employees' Health Insurance Plan that supplements an employee's or retiree's other employer group health insurance coverage.

17 "(14) SUPPLEMENTAL POLICY. A policy offered to 18 employees and retirees by the State Employees' Insurance 19 Board, in lieu of or in addition to coverage in the basic 20 medical plan of the State Employees' Health Insurance Plan, 21 that provides a defined set of benefits.

"(15) THIRD PARTY ADMINISTRATOR. An entity
 contracted by the State Employees' Insurance Board to provide
 certain administrative services as it deems appropriate and
 necessary to carry out its obligations under this chapter.

26 "(16) YEARS OF CREDITABLE COVERAGE. The number of
27 years and months that an employee is covered under the State

Employees' Health Insurance Plan prior to retirement as 1 determined by the State Employees' Insurance Board, including 2 any periods of full-time permanent employment subsequent to 3 4 retirement up to a maximum of five years. Creditable coverage shall also include months and years: (1) Related to service in 5 6 the United States Armed Forces; (2) as a part-time employee 7 prior to October 1, 2005; (3) as an employee as defined in Sections 16-25A-1 and 16-25A-11; (4) as a full time employee 8 9 of a local legislative delegation office which participates in 10 the Employees' Retirement System if the employee is under the state employees' insurance plan on June 14, 2011; (5) as an 11 12 employee of a postsecondary institution eligible for Public 13 Education Employees' Health Insurance Plan coverage as a 14 retiree whether the institution participates in the Public 15 Education Employees' Health Insurance Plan or has its own plan of insurance for active employees, provided the postsecondary 16 17 institution contributes an amount to the State Employees Insurance Fund for each of its retired employees equal to any 18 amount appropriated by the state to fund benefits for retired 19 employees as determined by the State Employees' Insurance 20 21 Board; or (6) as a juvenile probation officer provided that 22 the Administrative Office of Courts contributes an amount to 23 the State Employees Insurance Fund for each retired juvenile 24 probation officer equal to any amount appropriated by the 25 state to fund benefits for retired employees as determined by 26 the State Employees' Insurance Board. For employees of the Alabama State Port Authority and the USS Alabama Battleship 27

1 Commission, the term years of creditable coverage shall mean 2 the sum of the number of years and months of creditable service as determined by the Employees' Retirement System, the 3 4 Teachers' Retirement System, or the Judicial Retirement System with regard to any periods of time during which such employee 5 6 was employed under the Merit System plus the number of years 7 and months of creditable service as determined by the State Employees' Insurance Board with regard to any period of time 8 during which such employee was employed by the Alabama State 9 Port Authority or by the USS Alabama Battleship Commission as 10 11 a non-Merit System employee.

12 "(17) YEARS OF SERVICE. The number of years and 13 months of creditable service by an employee prior to 14 retirement as determined by the Employees' Retirement System, 15 Teachers' Retirement System, or Judicial Retirement System including any periods of full time permanent employment 16 17 subsequent to retirement up to a maximum of five years. Except for creditable service related to service in the United States 18 Armed Forces, or as an employee as defined in Sections 19 16-25A-1 and 16-25A-11, or as an employee of a postsecondary 20 21 institution eligible for PEEHIP coverage as a retiree whether 22 the institution participates in PEEHIP or has its own plan of 23 insurance for active employees, the State Employees' Insurance 24 Board may exclude from years of service any years and months of creditable service it determines was not related to service 25 26 as an employee as defined in Section 36-29-1. For employees of 27 the Alabama State Port Authority and the USS Alabama

Battleship Commission, the term years of service shall mean 1 2 the sum of the number of years and months of creditable service as determined by the Employees' Retirement System, the 3 4 Teachers' Retirement System, or the Judicial Retirement System with regard to any periods of time during which such employee 5 6 was employed under the Merit System plus the number of years 7 and months of creditable service as determined by the State Employees' Insurance Board with regard to any period of time 8 during which such employee was employed by the Alabama State 9 10 Port Authority or by the USS Alabama Battleship Commission as 11 a non-Merit System employee."

Section 2. This act shall become retroactive,
 effective to July 1, 2008.
