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22	To amend Sections 41-13-20 and 41-13-22 of the Code
23	of Alabama 1975, relating to the management of certain public
24	records by the State Records Commission and the Local
25	Government Commission, so as to provide further for the
26	membership of the commissions and their meetings days.
27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1Section 1. Sections 41-13-20 and 41-13-22 of the2Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:

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"§41-13-20.

4 "There is hereby created a State Records Commission consisting of seven nine members as follows: The Director of 5 6 the Department of Archives and History, who shall be chairman 7 chair of the commission; the Chief Examiner of the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts; the Attorney General; the 8 9 Secretary of State; the Commissioner of the Department of 10 Revenue; the Director of the Department of Finance; one member from the University of Alabama, to be designated by the head 11 12 of the department of history and Department of History; one 13 member from Auburn University, to be designated by the head of 14 the department of history Department of History; and one member, an archivist, historian, or librarian, from one of 15 Alabama's Historically Black Colleges and Universities 16 17 (HBCUs), to be appointed by the Governor. The representatives of the members from the University of Alabama, and Auburn 18 University, and the HBCUs may be removed by the Governor at 19 any time. All ex officio members, except the Director of the 20 21 Department of Archives and History, may select a designee to 22 represent him or her on the commission. No salary or 23 compensation shall be allowed any member of the commission except expenses incurred in the performance of their duties, 24 25 which expenses shall be paid pursuant to Article 2 of Chapter 7 of Title 36 of this code. The commission shall hold two 26 27 regular quarterly meetings in January, April, July and October of each year and at other times upon the call of the chairman
<u>chair</u>.

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"§41-13-22.

4 "There is hereby created a Local Government Records Commission consisting of  $\frac{12}{12}$  16 members as follows: The 5 6 Director of the Department of Archives and History, who shall 7 be the chairman chair of the commission; the Chief Examiner of the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts; the Attorney 8 9 General; the Secretary of State; one member from the 10 University of Alabama, to be designated by the head of the department of history Department of History; one member from 11 12 Auburn University, to be designated by the head of the 13 department of history Department of History; one member, an archivist, historian, or librarian, from one of Alabama's 14 Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), to be 15 appointed by the Governor; and one judge of probate judge who 16 17 is not chairman also chair of a county commission; two chairmen, one chair of a county commissions commission who are 18 is not also a judge of probate, one county administrator, one 19 county tax assessor taxation official, one superintendent of a 20 21 county or municipal school system, one county sheriff, one 22 municipal police chief, and two city clerks, each to be appointed by the Governor. The representatives of members from 23 the University of Alabama and, Auburn University, the HBCUs, 24 25 the judge of probate judges, the two chairmen of county commissions commission chair, the county administrator, the 26 tax assessors county taxation official, the superintendent of 27

a county or municipal school system, the county sheriff, the 1 2 municipal police chief, and the two city clerks may be removed by the Governor at any time. All ex officio members, except 3 the Director of the Department of Archives and History, may 4 select a designee to represent him or her on the commission. 5 No salary or compensation shall be allowed any member of the 6 7 commission except expenses incurred in the performance of their duties, which expenses shall be paid pursuant to Article 8 2 of Chapter 7 of Title 36. The commission shall hold regular 9 10 quarterly two meetings in January, April, July and October of each year and at other times upon the call of the chairman 11 12 chair. The quorum for the Local Government Records Commission shall be one more than half of the total of ex officio members 13 14 plus the filled appointed positions."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
