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4	SYNOPSIS:
5	Under existing law, a person performing pharmacy
6	services is required to have a permit issued by the
7	board. A person for the purposes of the pharmacy law
8	includes an individual or an entity.
9	This bill would provide that an entity, rather
10	than a person, providing pharmacy services to residents
11	of this state would be required to have a permit issued
12	by the board.

15	TO BE ENACTED
16	AN ACT
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18	Relating to the Board of Pharmacy; to amend Section
19	34-23-30 of the Code of Alabama 1975, relating to persons
20	required to have a permit issued by the board to perform
21	pharmacy services; to provide that an entity providing
22	pharmacy services to residents of this state, rather than a
23	person, would be required to have a permit issued by the
24	board.
25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
26	Section 1. Section 34-23-30 of the Code of Alabama
27	1975, is amended to read as follows:

28 **"**§34-23-30

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29	(a) Every pharmacy, hospital pharmacy, drugstore,
30	pharmacy department, prescription department, prescription
31	laboratory, dispensary, apothecary, or any other establishment
32	with a title implying the sale, offering for sale,
33	compounding, or dispensing of drugs in this state, or any
34	<pre>person performing entity providing pharmacy services for</pre>
35	patients residing in this state, shall register biennially and
36	receive a permit from the board. Any person desiring to open,
37	operate, maintain, or establish a pharmacy or <pre>perform to</pre>
38	<u>establish an entity to provide</u> pharmacy services in this state
39	shall apply to the board for a permit at least 30 days prior
40	to the opening of the business. No pharmacy or entity
41	performing pharmacy services shall open for the transaction of
42	business until it has been registered, inspected, and a permit
43	issued by the board. The application for a permit shall be
44	made on a form prescribed and furnished by the board which
45	when properly executed shall indicate the ownership desiring
46	such permit and the names and license numbers of all licensed
47	pharmacists employed as well as the location of the pharmacy
48	or entity where pharmacy services are performed and other
49	information as the board may require. If more than one
50	pharmacy or entity where pharmacy services are performed is
51	operated by the same owner, a separate application for
52	registration shall be made and a separate permit issued for
53	each such establishment. All permits issued under this section
54	shall become due on October 31 and shall become null and void
55	on December 31 of even-numbered years. Every application for a
56	permit for a new pharmacy or entity where pharmacy services

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57	are performed shall be accompanied by a fee to be determined
58	by the board, but the fee shall not be less than one hundred
59	dollars (\$100) nor more than two hundred dollars (\$200). Every
60	application for a renewal permit shall be accompanied by a fee
61	to be determined by the board, but the fee shall not be less
62	than fifty dollars (\$50) nor more than one hundred fifty
63	dollars (\$150). Every application for a permit due to transfer
64	of ownership shall be accompanied by a fee to be determined by
65	the board, but the fee shall not be less than one hundred
66	fifty dollars (\$150) nor more than four hundred dollars
67	(\$400). Every application for a permit for an out-of-state
68	pharmacy or entity where pharmacy services are performed shall
69	be accompanied by a fee to be determined by the board, but the
70	fee shall not be less than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750)
71	nor more than two thousand dollars (\$2,000). Every application
72	for a renewal permit for an out-of-state pharmacy or entity
73	where pharmacy services are performed shall be accompanied by
74	a fee to be determined by the board, but the fee shall not be
75	less than four hundred dollars (\$400) nor more than seven
76	hundred fifty dollars (\$750). Each application for the renewal
77	of a permit shall be made on or before October 31 of each
78	even-numbered year, at which time the previous permit shall
79	become null and void on December 31 of even-numbered years. A
80	penalty of twenty-five dollars (\$25) for each overdue month
81	shall be assessed in addition to the permit fee for renewal of
82	delinquent permits. The secretary of the board shall issue a
83	permit for each pharmacy or entity where pharmacy services are
84	performed whose application is found to be satisfactory by the

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board. Permits issued under this section shall not be 85 86 transferable. Any change in the control of ownership or 87 licensed pharmacists shall be reported to the board in writing 88 within 10 days of such occurrence. If the pharmacy or entity 89 where pharmacy services are performed is owned by a 90 corporation, the permit shall be issued in the name of the 91 corporation. It shall be the duty of the owners of pharmacies 92 or the owners of entities where pharmacy services are 93 performed who are not licensed pharmacists to immediately notify the board upon the termination of employment of 94 95 licensed pharmacists and to cause the surrender of permits as indicated. The further operation of the pharmacy or entity 96 97 where pharmacy services are performed in the absence of 98 licensed pharmacists is forbidden; provided, that the 99 nonregistered owner shall have a period of 30 days within which to comply with this subsection. The next of kin of any 100 101 deceased licensed pharmacist owner shall have a period of 30 102 days within which to comply with this chapter, during which 103 time no prescriptions shall be filled unless a licensed 104 pharmacist is on duty. No mail order pharmacy shall transact 105 business in this state without a permit from the board. 106

(b) Requirements for the grant of authority by the board to any person who offers or performs entity providing pharmacy services shall be by board rule.

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109 (c) Nothing contained in this section related to
110 pharmacy services permits shall be interpreted to delegate to
111 the board the authority to promulgate adopt rules governing
112 pharmacy benefit managers.



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113	(d) Any person who violates this section shall be
114	guilty of a misdemeanor."
115	Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first
116	day of the third month following its passage and approval by
117	the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
