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| 4  | SYNOPSIS:  |
| 5  | Under existing law, a registered voter may only                |
| 6  | vote by absentee ballot if he or she meets one of the          |
| 7  | criteria prescribed by law for voting absentee.                |
| 8  | This bill would allow a registered voter to vote               |
| 9  | by absentee ballot without an excuse.                          |

| 16 | Relating to voting; to amend Sections 17-11-3 and              |
| 17 | 17-11-7, Code of Alabama 1975; to authorize absentee voting    |
| 18 | without an excuse.   |
| 19 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:                   |
| 20 | Section 1. Sections 17-11-3 and 17-11-7, Code of               |
| 21 | Alabama 1975, are amended to read as follows:                  |
| 22 | <b>"</b> §17-11-3  |
| 23 | (a) Any qualified elector of this state may apply for          |
| 24 | and vote an absentee ballot by mail, by hand deliveryin        |
| 25 | person, or by commercial carrier, as determined by rule by the |
| 26 | Secretary of State, as provided in Sections 17-11-5 and        |
| 27 | 17-11-9, in any primary, general, special, or municipal        |
| 28 | election, if he or she makes application in writing. and meets |



| 29  | one or more of the following requirements:                    |

| 30  | (1) The person expects to be out of the county or the         |

| 33  | (2) The person has any physical illness or infirmity          |
| 34  | which prevents his or her attendance at the polls, whether he |
| 35  | or she is within or without the county on the day of the      |
| 36  | election.   |
| 37  | (3) The person expects to work a shift which has at           |
| 38  | least 10 hours which coincide with the hours the polls are    |
| 39  | open at his or her regular polling place.                     |
| 40  | (4) The person is enrolled as a student at an                 |
| 41  | educational institution located outside the county of his or  |
| 42  | her personal residence, attendance at which prevents his or   |
| 43  | her attendance at the polls.                                  |

| 45  | of a member of, the Armed Forces of the United States or is   |
| 46  | similarly qualified to vote absentee pursuant to the federal  |

| 49  | (6) The person has been appointed as an election              |
| 50  | officer or named as a poll watcher at a polling place other   |
| 51  | than his or her regular polling place.                        |

| 54  | the family member is confined to his or her home.             |

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- (b) Applications returned by mail must be received not less than seven days prior to the election. Applications returned by hand must be received not less than five days prior to the election.
- 62 (c) An applicant for an absentee ballot who is a member 63 of the Armed Forces of the United States, including the 64 Alabama National Guard, the United States Naval Reserves, the 65 United States Air Force Reserves, and the United States Army Reserve on active duty or active duty for training or an 66 67 applicant who is the spouse of any member of the armed forces or any other applicant qualified to vote absentee pursuant to 68 69 the federal Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting 70 Act, 52 U.S.C. §§ 20301-20311, may make application for an 71 absentee ballot by filling out the federal postcard application form, authorized and provided for under the 72 73 provisions of The Federal Voting Assistance Act of 1955, 74 Public Law 296, Chapter 656, H.R. 4048, approved August 9, 75 1955, 84th Congress 1st Session.
  - (d) Any registered elector who requires emergency treatment of a licensed physician within five days of an election may apply for an emergency absentee ballot for the election and may vote by returning the absentee ballot no later than noon on the day the election is held. The attendant physician shall describe and certify the circumstances as constituting an emergency on a special form designed by the Secretary of State and provided by his or her office to local absentee election managers. The special form shall be attached



85 to the application.

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- 86 (e)(1) Any registered elector whose name appears on the 87 poll list of qualified voters may vote by an emergency 88 absentee ballot if any of the following situations arise:
- a. The elector is required by his or her employer under unforeseen circumstances within five days before an election to be unavailable to vote at the polls on election day.
- b. The elector is a caregiver of a person who requires emergency treatment by a licensed physician within five days before an election.
- 95 c. A family member to the second degree of kinship by 96 affinity or consanguinity of an elector dies within five days 97 before an election.
- (2) Under such circumstances, the elector shall apply 98 99 for an emergency absentee ballot at the office of the absentee 100 election manager no later than the close of the business day 101 one day prior to the election. The applicant shall complete 102 and file an application form designed by the Secretary of 103 State for emergency absentee voters. The form shall contain an 104 affidavit which the applicant shall sign or swear 105 acknowledging that he or she was not aware of the situation 106 constituting the emergency prior to five days before the 107 election. An applicant who meets the requirements of this subsection may vote by an emergency absentee ballot. After 108 109 voting the ballot, the voter shall hand the ballot to the 110 absentee election manager.
  - (f) If the occurrence of a state of emergency as declared in this or any other state, or by the federal



government, renders substantial compliance with this article impossible or unreasonable for a group of qualified voters who respond to the emergency, the Secretary of State, pursuant to Section 41-22-5, may adopt an emergency rule to allow those qualified voters to vote by absentee ballot. Notwithstanding any other laws to the contrary, all expenses and costs incurred by the state or any county in carrying out the responsibilities and duties included in an emergency rule adopted pursuant to this subsection shall be paid by the State of Alabama from any funds made available for election expenses under state and federal law.

- applicable law, in the event more than one absentee ballot is cast in the name of the single voter, whether any multiple ballot is cast by mail or otherwise, none of the affidavit envelopes containing the multiple ballots shall be opened, and none of the multiple ballots shall be counted, except in the event of an election contest, upon the order of the election contest tribunal. Upon the conclusion of an election contest or, in the event no contest is filed, upon the expiration of time for filing a contest, the multiple ballots shall be provided to the district attorney, with photocopies provided to the state Attorney General, for the investigation, prosecution, or other action as may be appropriate under applicable law."
