5	Existing law establishes state holidays.
6	This bill would specify that the State of
7	Alabama shall observe as holidays all days designated
8	as a holiday by the federal government.
9	This bill would delete duplicative language and
10	would also make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to
11	update the existing code language to current style.
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14	A BILL
15	TO BE ENTITLED
16	AN ACT
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18	Relating to state holidays; to amend Section 1-3-8,
19	Code of Alabama 1975; to specify that the State of Alabama
20	shall observe as holidays days designated as a holiday by the
21	federal government; and to delete duplicative language and
22	make nonsubstantive, technical revisions to update the
23	existing code language to current style.
24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. Section 1-3-8, Code of Alabama 1975, is
26	amended to read as follows:
27	"\$1-3-8
28	(a) Sunday, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Martin



29	Luther King, Jr.'s birthday, Robert E. Lee's birthday, George
30	Washington's birthday, Thomas Jefferson's birthday,
31	Confederate Memorial Day, National Memorial Day, Jefferson
32	Davis' birthday, the Fourth day of July, Labor Day, Columbus
33	Day and Fraternal Day, Veterans' Day, American Indian Heritage
34	Day, and the day designated by the Governor for public
35	thanksgiving shall each be deemed a holiday. If any holiday
36	falls on Sunday, the following day is the holiday. If any
37	holiday falls on Saturday, the preceding day is the holiday.
38	Veterans' Day shall be observed by the closing of all state,
39	county, and municipal offices, all banks located within this
40	state, and the public schools on such day. Public schools,
41	grades K to 12, inclusive, and all public two-year
42	institutions of higher education shall also be closed on
43	National Memorial Day, and such closing shall be applicable to
44	all students and non-essential employees. The State of Alabama
45	shall recognize and observe the following days as public and
46	legal holidays:
47	(1) All days which have been designated as of January
48	1, 2022, as public and legal holidays by the federal
49	government.
50	(2) All other days designated and proclaimed by the
51	Governor as public and legal holidays or as days of fasting
52	and prayer or other religious observance. If the Governor
53	designates additional days pursuant to this subdivision, the
54	Governor shall include at least one of the following dates:
55	a. The third Monday in January.
56	b. The fourth Monday in April.



57	c. The first Monday in June.
58	d. A suitable date in lieu thereof to commemorate the
59	event or events observed by the dates in paragraphs a. through
60	<u>C.</u>
61	(b) If any holiday falls on Saturday, the preceding day
62	is the holiday.
63	(c) The Governor shall close all state offices and
64	facilities a minimum of 13 days throughout the year and not
65	more than 13 days in observance of the public and legal
66	holidays and other days set forth in subsection (a). The
67	Governor shall also specify the days state offices and
68	facilities shall be closed in observation of public and legal
69	holidays.
70	(d) The Superintendent of Banks, with the concurrence
71	of not less than two members of the state Banking Board, may
72	authorize any state bank to close on National Memorial Day,
73	the last Monday in May, the closure of state banks in
74	observance of any state or federal holiday and on such any
75	other days day as may be declared by the Governor to be <u>a</u>
76	state holidays holiday or by the President of the United
77	States to be a federal holiday in honor of a special event. If
78	any authorized a state holiday falls on Friday, the
79	Superintendent of Banks may authorize the Saturday following
80	that Friday to be a holiday. The superintendent may also
81	authorize the closing of banks at 12:00 noon on the day prior
82	to Christmas Day $_{ au}$ and the day prior to New Year's Day, if such
83	days the holidays fall on business days.
84	(b) Of the above enumerated legal public holidays, the



85	following shall be observed on the dates herein prescribed:
86	(1) Robert E. Lee's birthday - the third Monday in
87	January.
88	(2) George Washington's birthday - the third Monday in
89	February.
90	(3) Confederate Memorial Day - the fourth Monday in
91	April.
92	(4) Jefferson Davis' birthday - the first Monday in
93	June.
94	(5) Columbus Day and Fraternal Day - the second Monday
95	in October.
96	(6) Veterans' Day - the eleventh day of November.
97	(7) Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday - the third
98	Monday in January.
99	(8) National Memorial Day - the last Monday in May.
100	(9) Thomas Jefferson's birthday - the third Monday in
101	February.
102	(10) American Indian Heritage Day - the second Monday
103	in October.
104	(c)(1) In addition to the legal holidays provided
105	above in subsection (a), Mardi Gras shall be deemed a holiday
106	in Mobile and Baldwin Counties and all state offices shall be
107	closed in those counties on Mardi Gras.
108	(d)(2) All In addition to the legal holidays provided
109	above all state employees, except other than those employed in
110	Baldwin and Mobile Counties $_{m{ au}}$ shall be granted one personal
111	leave day per year. The personal leave day shall be granted on

112 January 1 of each year. All state employees employed in



113 Baldwin and Mobile Counties shall be granted no personal leave day. All such personal leave days granted in any year pursuant 114 115 to this section shall be used by the end of the calendar year. 116 All such personal leave days shall and must be scheduled 117 during the year with the approval of the supervisor. Supervisors failing to schedule personal leave days for 118 119 employees shall justify that action in writing to the Director 120 of State Personnel and the employee shall receive pay at a rate not less than the employee's usual and customary rate of 121 pay for any personal leave day not taken by December 31 of 122 123 each year.

(c) (f) (1) All state holidays shall be observed by the 124 closing of all state offices. Any state office may remain open 125 126 on a state holiday upon written notice by the appointing 127 authority to the State Personnel Board at least 60 days in advance of the holiday. Provided, that In addition, any state 128 129 office may be opened in the event of an emergency, and the 130 State Personnel Board may grant a blanket approval for the 131 openings opening of state offices needing to be open on 132 holidays on a regular basis for essential services.

133 (2) Any state employee working on a state holiday shall
134 receive a day of compensatory leave or paid compensation in
135 lieu of the holiday as provided herein.

136 (f) (g) Each employee shall attempt to schedule any 137 compensatory leave day provided in lieu of a regularly 138 scheduled holiday, subject to the approval of the his or her 139 supervisor, during the quarter that the regularly scheduled 140 holiday occurred. If any compensatory leave day cannot be



141 scheduled during the designated quarter, the compensatory 142 leave day may be accumulated at the request of the employee 143 for up to one year. Supervisors failing to schedule 144 compensatory leave days for employees within the quarter, 145 unless the day is carried forward at the request of the employee, shall justify that action in writing to the Director 146 147 of State Personnel and the employee shall receive pay at a 148 rate not less than the employee's usual and customary rate of 149 pay for any compensatory leave day to which the employee may be entitled and which has not been taken. 150

151 (q) (1) (h) (1) The first day in December of each year is designated as Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day in this state. All 152 153 citizens of this state are requested to devote some portion of 154 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day to commemorate the accomplishments of 155 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks, a woman of great courage, vision, love, and faith who helped usher in the modern civil rights movement 156 on December 1, 1955, by refusing to give up her seat on a bus 157 158 in Montgomery, Alabama. Each resident of this state is 159 requested to observe the day with appropriate activities.

160 (2) Each county and municipality may elect to observe161 Mrs. Rosa L. Parks Day as a holiday."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on January 163 1, 2024, following its passage and approval by the Governor, 164 or its otherwise becoming law.
