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11	WHEREAS, rare diseases affect approximately 400,000
12	citizens in Alabama; there is no collaboration among rare
13	disease groups to provide these people a voice in state
14	government; and
15	WHEREAS, a council of knowledgeable professionals in
16	this area could help Alabama leaders better understand and
17	address the needs of rare disease patients; and
18	WHEREAS, progress in health care for all state
19	citizens is a critical concern for this body; appropriate
20	measures can be taken on a state level that can positively
21	impact Alabama citizens with rare diseases; now therefore,
22	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
23	HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That there is created the Rare
24	Disease Advisory Council within the School of Medicine of the
25	University of Alabama at Birmingham to advise the Governor and
26	the Legislature on research, diagnosis, treatment, and
27	education relating to rare diseases.

1 (a) The appointing authorities shall coordinate
2 their appointments to assure that the membership of the
3 council is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender,
4 geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state.

- (b) The membership of the council shall consist of the following:
- (1) One physician affiliated with the University of South Alabama appointed by the Governor who is licensed and practicing in Alabama with experience researching, diagnosing, or treating rare diseases.
- (2) One pediatrician appointed by the Governor who is licensed and practicing in Alabama with experience researching, diagnosing, or treating rare diseases.
- (3) One medical researcher appointed by the Governor who has experience conducting research concerning rare disease.
- (4) One registered nurse or advanced practice registered nurse appointed by the Governor who is licensed and practicing in Alabama with experience treating rare diseases.
- (5) One pediatric nurse practitioner appointed by the Governor who is licensed and practicing in Alabama with experience treating rare diseases.
- (6) One hospital administrator, or designee, appointed by the Governor, from a pediatric hospital in Alabama that cares for patients with rare diseases.

1 (7) One hospital administrator, or designee,
2 appointed by the Governor, from a hospital in Alabama that
3 cares for patients with rare diseases.

- (8) One representative appointed by the Governor from each academic research institution in Alabama that receives any grant funding for rare disease research.
- (9) One representative from each of the seven Congressional districts who resides in the district, appointed by the Governor, and who represents an IRS-established non-profit rare disease foundation.
- (10) The State Health Officer shall be an ex officio member of the council.
 - (11) One member of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
- (12) One member of the Senate appointed by the Senate Minority Leader.
 - (13) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
 - (14) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.
- 22 (c) The council shall have all of the following duties:
 - (1) Discuss strategies to improve understanding of the diagnosis, treatment, and impact of rare diseases.
 - (2) Collect data on rare diseases including the cost and economic impact for people in Alabama.

1 (3) Coordinate rare disease collaborations across
2 Alabama, including academic medical centers, investigators,
3 relevant funding agencies, biotech companies, and advocacy
4 groups.

- (4) Highlight collaborations and synergy between clinicians and investigators, academic medical centers, state and federal funding agencies, biotech and pharmaceutical companies, and non-profit research and medical institutions.
- (5) Report findings to the Alabama Legislature annually with the goal to address changes in rare disease policies that will positively impact citizens and the state.
- (d) Members shall be appointed for terms of three years. No member shall serve more than two consecutive terms. A member shall serve until his or her successor is appointed and qualified.
- (e) Initial appointments to this council shall be made within 60 days of the adoption of this resolution.
- (f) Upon the recommendation of the Dean of the School of Medicine of the University of Alabama at Birmingham, the Governor shall appoint the chair of the council.
- (g) Total membership of the council consists of the number of members serving on the council not including vacant positions. A quorum shall consist of a simple majority of total membership and shall be sufficient to conduct the transaction of business of the council.
 - (h) The council shall meet at least quarterly.

- 1 (i) Council members shall receive no compensation
- 2 for their services.
