WHEREAS, cuts to funding and frequent deviations in 1 the ARI have weakened its effectiveness, leading to a 2 3 significant backslide in students' reading readiness and literacy skills; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the mission of the ARI is to put specialized reading coaches armed with evidence-based teaching 6 7 methods in schools where they are needed the most; and WHEREAS, literacy skills provide the foundation for 8 9 all learning; now therefore,

10 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 11 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the State of Alabama must 12 fully support, retool, and refocus the Alabama Reading 13 Initiative with a "back to basics" approach by restoring 14 funding for the Alabama Reading Initiative.
