13	WHEREAS, the Alabama Department of Economic and
14	Community Affairs (ADECA) administers the Alabama
15	Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP), a federally funded
16	program that provides much needed home weatherization upgrades
17	to low-income households throughout the state through ADECA
18	agreements with local community action agencies; and
19	WHEREAS, Alabama Community Action Agencies' current
20	procedure for requesting funds from ADECA for weatherization
21	assistance is cumbersome resulting in unnecessary delay in the
22	granting of funds for weatherization assistance; and
23	WHEREAS, this procedure adversely impacts the WAPs
24	mission to generate significant savings in energy costs for
25	low-income households, particularly those having elderly
26	persons, disabled persons, and families with children; and

WHEREAS, thousands of low-income households are struggling with extremely high energy bills as we are experiencing one of the coldest winters in recent memory because of the current procedure for requesting funds for weatherization assistance; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That by copy of this resolution we urge Alabama Community Action Agencies to revise their procedure for requesting funds for weatherization assistance so that participation in WAP projects may be increased and all available funding for weatherization upgrades may be spent for the thousands of households in greatest need in this state.
