WHEREAS, Alabama's public community college system is the state's single largest system of public higher education and is Alabama's most affordable and accessible system of higher education; and

WHEREAS, the three foundational pillars of the Alabama Community College System, academic transfer, workforce development, and adult education, make a positive impact on the more than 250,000 people served annually and the people of our great state; and

WHEREAS, with our unified network of 25 community and technical colleges, Marion Military Institute (one of only three public military two-year colleges in the country), and 89 instructional sites, community and technical colleges are firmly planted in every county and are within easy reach of every community in this state; additionally, the Alabama Technology Network provides innovative technical assistance to hundreds of businesses each year; and

WHEREAS, forty-one percent of all Alabamians enrolled in public higher education are enrolled at an ACCS institution, and approximately 15,000 community college

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WHEREAS, more than 254,000 students in Alabama's community colleges have utilized the Statewide Articulation and Transfer Reporting System to assure the transfer of their academic work toward bachelor's degrees at four-year institutions since the articulation agreement's inception in 1998; and

whereas, the Alabama Community College System enrolled more than 8,100 high school students in its dual enrollment and early college programs in 2014, providing high achieving students with rigorous courses beyond those offered at the secondary level, increasing college access to those who would not otherwise be college bound, and awarding 3,700 scholarships during the past academic year to students enrolled in ACCS career technical education courses, preparing them for high wage, high demand occupations; and

WHEREAS, the Alabama Technology Network has worked with more than 3,500 Alabama companies over the past decade, providing technical assistance that improved efficiency and profitability; ATN's work is credited with saving or retaining 14,000 jobs during that period; Alabama businesses, with the help of ATN, increased profits by more than \$129,000,000 during 2014; and

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WHEREAS, more than 450,000 working-age adults have
neither a high school diploma nor a GED; the Alabama Community
College System awarded more than 4,900 GED Certificates and
served more than 29,000 individuals through its adult literacy
education programs and services in 2014; and

WHEREAS, the community college system remains committed to its mission of educating and training the people of Alabama, thus building stronger communities and a stronger economy; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we hereby recognize the accomplishments of Alabama's public community college system as it continues to fulfill its unique and distinctive mission of providing a unified system of institutions delivering accessible, affordable and superior educational opportunities, and workforce training and services to all of Alabama, yielding a well-educated, productive citizenry and a better prepared workforce.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we recognize April as National Community College Month in Alabama and urge all Alabamians and business and industry leaders, who are committed to developing Alabama's workforce for the 21st century, to use and support their local community colleges.
