8 WHEREAS, we take great pride and pleasure in
9 congratulating the Good Hope High School Girls Basketball
10 Team, from Cullman County, on winning the 2024 Alabama High
11 School Athletic Association (AHSAA) Class 4A Girls
12 Basketball State Championship; and

13 WHEREAS, on March 4, 2024, at the BJCC Legacy Arena,
14 the Lady Raiders, through teamwork, diligence, and an
15 unwavering commitment to excellence, propelled the
16 top-ranked Raiders to a 63-35 decisive victory over T.R.
17 Miller to claim the first State Title in program history and
18 the first State Championship of any sport in school history;
19 and

20 WHEREAS, the team is filled with exceptional
21 athletes, but several stood out for their game-changing
22 plays; senior Bailey Tetro finished with 17 points on
23 6-of-11 shooting and added six rebounds, five assists, and
24 seven steals; she scored the first six points of the game
25 and ignited an 8-0 run late in the second period to give the
26 Raiders a double-digit lead at halftime, and rightfully
27 earned the title of Most Valuable Player; and

28 WHEREAS, Ivey Maddox led the Raiders with a game-high

29 20 points, with five rebounds and two steals; Ava McSwain
30 had 12 points and two boards; Heather Tetro contributed two
31 assists and three steals; Charly Johnson added eight points
32 and eight rebounds; and Lillie McCluskey and Lucie Adams had
33 three points each as they bookended the final period on
34 long-range shots; and

35 WHEREAS, the title-winning team shot 43.6 percent
36 overall and 10-of-13 at the foul line while holding T.R.
37 Miller to 31.3 percent from the field; and

38 WHEREAS, Bailey Tetro (MVP), Ava McSwain, and Ivey
39 Maddox formed an exemplary representation of skill and
40 sportsmanship in the tournament and were named to the Class
41 4A Girls All-Tournament Team; and

42 WHEREAS, the Good Hope Girls Basketball Team has been
43 superbly coached and inspired by Head Coach Justin Aby and
44 assistant coaches Nina Moss and Beth Taylor; under their
45 leadership the players have broadened their knowledge of the
46 game, refined their skills in execution, and maintained the
47 tradition of superior play and true sportsmanship; and

48 WHEREAS, the talented athletes of the Good Hope Girls
49 Basketball Team are Lexi Marshall, Ava McSwain, Lillie
50 McCluskey, Emma Thompson, Ella Gossett, Ivey Maddox, Jordan
51 Sanders, Charly Johnson, Jolee McHan, Lucie Adams, Heather
52 Tetro, and Bailey Tetro; and the team managers are Reese Fox
53 and Jayden McHan; and
