Congress and that challenge to be heard as an original case
and ruled on by the U. S. Supreme Court.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and the members of the Alabama Congressional Delegation as an expression of the sentiment of the Alabama Legislature.
