1 Enrolled, An Act,

2 EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR THE IRANIAN PEOPLES' DESIRE
3 FOR A DEMOCRATIC, SECULAR, AND NON-NUCLEAR REPUBLIC OF IRAN
4 AND CONDEMNING VIOLATIONS OF HUMAN RIGHTS AND
5 STATE-SPONSORED TERRORISM BY THE IRANIAN GOVERNMENT.

7 WHEREAS, the First Amendment to the Constitution of 8 the United States guarantees freedom of assembly, speech, 9 and the right to petition the government for a redress of 10 grievances; the right to protest is also protected under international human rights law by provisions enshrined in 11 various international and regional treaties guaranteeing 12 13 each of these distinct yet mutually reinforcing rights; but many countries' governments do not offer these rights and 14 15 protections; one such nation is the Islamic Republic of Iran; and 16

WHEREAS, beginning in 2017 and continuing for several months, the Iranian regime suppressed economic, political, and social protests with repressive forces that resulted in at least 25 deaths and 4,000 arrests; and

21 WHEREAS, on November 15, 2019, popular protests 22 against the Iranian regime began and spread rapidly to at 23 least 100 cities throughout the country with reports 24 indicating that Iranian security forces used lethal force, 25 killing approximately 1,500 people in less than two weeks of 26 unrest, and thousands more were detained; and

27 WHEREAS, beginning in September 2022, anti-government 28 protests, many of which were led by women and youths,



29 ignited in response to the death of Mahsa Amini, a 30 22-year-old Kurdish Iranian woman who was arrested by the morality police that enforce Iran's mandatory dress code 31 32 laws; in retaliation, the Iranian regime's security forces 33 have killed hundreds and arrested tens of thousands of protesters, two of whom, Mohsen Shekari and Majidreza 34 35 Rahnavard, were hung on December 8 and 12, 2022, in Tehran 36 and Mashhad, while dozens more have been convicted of 37 "Moharebeh" (waging war on God) and are at risk of 38 execution; and

39 WHEREAS, these protests are rooted in the more than 40 four decades of organized resistance against the Iranian 41 dictatorship, which most recently have been led by women who 42 have endured torture, sexual and gender-based violence, and 43 death; and

WHEREAS, the similarity in slogans and tactics used by protests nationwide reflect the overarching demands of the Iranian people for social freedom and political change and point to the organized, unified national nature of the protests; and

49 WHEREAS, in the 118th Congress, the House of 50 Representatives passed House Concurrent Resolution 7, "Condemning the Iranian regime's human rights abuses against 51 52 the brave women and men of Iran peacefully demonstrating in 53 more than 133 cities"; House Concurrent Resolution 7 urges 54 the administration to support the people of Iran and calls on the international community to publicly condemn violence 55 by the Iranian regime against peaceful protesters, to speak 56



57 out against violations by the regime of fundamental human 58 rights, including freedom of expression, assembly, and 59 redress of grievances of the Iranian people; and

60 WHEREAS, on November 24, 2022, the United Nations 61 Human Rights Council established a fact-finding mission to 62 conduct an independent investigation into the ongoing deadly 63 violence related to the protests in Iran that began on 64 September 16, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Department of State's 2021 Country 65 66 Reports on Human Rights Practices, released on April 13, 2022, cites that Iran's "government and its agents 67 reportedly committed arbitrary or unlawful killings, most 68 69 commonly executions for crimes not meeting the international legal standard of 'most serious crimes' or for crimes 70 71 committed by juvenile offenders, as well as executions after 72 trials without due process"; and

73 WHEREAS, senior Iranian government, military, 74 judicial, and security officials have for decades ordered or 75 committed eqregious human rights violations and acts of terror; the Iranian regime has arbitrarily and brutally 76 77 suppressed ethnic and religious minorities, including 78 Iranian Kurds, Baluchis, Arabs, Christians, Jews, Baha'is, Zoroastrians, and even Sunni Muslims; deprived them of their 79 80 basic human rights; and has in many cases executed them; the 81 Iranian people have been denied fundamental freedoms, for 82 which reason they are rejecting dictatorship and religious 83 tyranny; and

WHEREAS, during the 2022 protests in Iran, tens of



85 thousands of Americans gathered throughout the United States to call for the end of the Iranian regime and show 86 87 solidarity with the protesters risking their lives to reclaim their country and establish freedom, human rights, 88 89 and democracy in Iran; and 90 WHEREAS, the Islamic Republic's malign activities in 91 the Middle East and around the world pose a threat to the 92 United States' national security interests and those of our 93 allies, including Israel; and 94 WHEREAS, senior Iranian government, military, judicial, and security officials have ordered or committed 95 egregious human rights violations and acts of terror; 96 97 instead of representing the interests of the Iranian people, the Iranian regime has long used its Foreign Ministry and 98 99 diplomatic representations abroad to orchestrate terror 100 plots and whitewash gross human rights violations in Iran; 101 and 102 WHEREAS, on July 2, 2018, the Belgian Federal

102 WHEREAS, ON Surg 2, 2010, the Bergran Federal 103 Prosecutor's Office announced it had foiled a terrorist plot 104 against the "Free Iran 2018-the Alternative" gathering held 105 on June 30, 2018, in support of the Iranian people's 106 struggle for freedom; and

107 WHEREAS, Assadollah Assadi, a senior Iranian diplomat 108 based in the Iranian embassy in Vienna, Austria, was 109 arrested in Germany and in February 2021 was convicted in 110 Belgium and sentenced to 20 years of imprisonment in 111 connection with the planned terror plot in Paris at the Free 112 Iran gathering; Assadollah Assadi served as the third



113 secretary of the Iranian embassy in Austria; and

114 WHEREAS, on December 15, 2022, the Special Court for 115 Combating Corruption and Organized Crime in Albania 116 sentenced an Iranian national to 10 years in prison on 117 terrorism related charges, including attempts to engage in espionage and the assassination of Iranian dissidents in 118 119 Albania; Iran's malign activities in the Balkans pose a 120 serious threat to the United States' national security 121 interests: and

122 WHEREAS, on November 23, 2022, the Department of the 123 Treasury announced additional action on Iranian security 124 forces, including Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps forces, 125 for their violent crackdown on anti-government protests in 126 Iran's Kurdistan Province and surrounding areas; Iran is 127 recognized as the number one state sponsor of terrorism 128 worldwide, and any actions to allow the Iranian regime to 129 facilitate nuclear or other terrorist plots must be 130 condemned; and

131 WHEREAS, Qasem Soleimani was the world's most 132 prolific terrorist, personally culpable for the deaths of 133 over 600 Americans and the maiming of thousands more, 134 including the torture and killing of tens of thousands of 135 people across the Middle East; he was personally sanctioned 136 by the United Nations and the European Union and was 137 designated a terrorist by the United States of America; the 138 strength and decisive action taken by former President 139 Donald J. Trump in eliminating Qasem Soleimani was a 140 monumental achievement in the War on Terror, sending a clear



141 message that the United States of America will not allow her 142 citizens to be attacked by terrorists without retaliation; 143 and

144 WHEREAS, the Iranian regime recently engaged in a 145 terror plot in Jordan that killed three American soldiers 146 and injured 40 more; and

147 WHEREAS, the members of this body condemn past and 148 present Iranian state-sponsored terrorist attacks against 149 United States citizens and officials as well as Iranian 150 dissidents, including the Iranian regime's terror plot 151 against the "Free Iran 2018-the Alternative" gathering in 152 Paris; now therefore,

153 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 154 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the members of this body 155 call on relevant United States government agencies to work 156 with European allies, including those in the Balkans where 157 Iran has expanded its presence, to hold Iran accountable for breaching diplomatic privileges; we also call on nations to 158 prevent the malign activities of the Iranian regime's 159 160 diplomatic missions with the goal of closing them down and 161 expelling its agents.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the members of this body stand with the people of Iran who are legitimately defending their rights for freedom against repression as well as condemn the brutal killing of Iranian protesters by the regime.

167 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the members of this body 168 recognize the rights of the Iranian people and their



169 struggle to establish a democratic, secular, and non-nuclear 170 Republic of Iran with the right to vote, free elections, and 171 ethnic equality, as well as a foreign policy based on 172 peaceful coexistence.
