4 HJR____ URGING THE STATE OF ALABAMA PERSONNEL DEPARMENT TO
5 CONDUCT A STUDY OF STATE TROOPER PAY.

7 WHEREAS, the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency 8 (ALEA) is the premier state agency whose mission is to 9 efficiently provide quality service, protection, and safety 10 for the State of Alabama through the utilization of 11 consolidated law enforcement, investigative, and support 12 services; state troopers are a vital component to this 13 mission; and

14 WHEREAS, state troopers patrol the interstate and 15 other major highways of this state, maintaining the flow of 16 essential traffic for residents, visitors, and commerce, as 17 well as investigating motor vehicle accidents and performing 18 special duties during emergencies; and

19 WHEREAS, pay disparities for law enforcement officers 20 place this state at a disadvantage in this region and 21 nationally; and

22 WHEREAS, in order to ensure that state troopers, who 23 are essential personnel in regards to public safety, are 24 receiving adequate and competitive pay, a study needs to be 25 conducted by the agency that has the best ability to gather, 26 analyze, and compile the data necessary to make this 27 determination; and

WHEREAS, the role of the State Personnel Department

29 is to provide information relating to jobs in the state 30 Merit System; in doing so, the department ensures competitive classification and pay plans and conducts salary 31 reviews of agency-specific classifications; now therefore, 32 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 33 34 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the State of Alabama 35 Personnel Department, with the cooperation of ALEA, is 36 strongly urged to conduct a study of state trooper pay in relation to the pay of similar positions in other states in 37 38 the Southeast region and other law enforcement agencies in this state and to provide a report to the Legislature with 39 recommendations prior to the first day of the 2025 Regular 40
