9	COMMEMORATING THE BILL OF RIGHTS OF THE U.S. CONSTITUTION.

11	WHEREAS, the lasting promises of our great nation,
L2	those of freedom from oppression and the preservation of
L3	individual liberty, are fundamental themes of the very
L 4	document upon which our system of government was founded; and
L 5	WHEREAS, the central importance of the principles
L 6	outlined in the United States Constitution once prompted
L7	President Harry Truman to describe it as "a living force";
L 8	similarly, President Ronald Reagan evoked the power of the
L 9	individual liberties safeguarded by the constitution,
20	referring to "a government which empowers its people" as
21	"mankind's best defense against tyranny," and nowhere are
22	these constitutional guarantees regarding the rights of the
23	individual articulated more clearly than in the first 10
24	amendments - the aptly named Bill of Rights; and
25	WHEREAS, while the Capitol grounds and other
26	properties and sites throughout the state display statues

memorials, and commemorations of people, ideals, and events that demonstrate our country's abiding dedication to the values established by the Bill of Rights, there is no specific tribute to the Bill of Rights; and

WHEREAS, the general laws of the state authorize the Alabama Historical Commission to provide for the placement and acquisition of historical sites and monuments, and the Department of Finance Division of Construction Management to acquire property and structures in the name of the State of Alabama; and

WHEREAS, we find that a commemorative structure to honor the Bill of Rights would be a worthy addition to the recognition and memorialization of historic sites in this state; and we support the inclusion of a monument that will convey to visitors a sense of history and the faith in human liberty symbolized by the Bill of Rights; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we hereby encourage the Alabama Historical Commission and the Department of Finance Division of Construction Management, subject to state law and rules of the commission and the division, to approve and permit the construction or acquisition of a monument on state property to specifically commemorate the Bill of Rights of the United States Constitution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That no public funds be used for the design and construction of the monument.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That official copies of this
resolution be provided to the executive director of the
Alabama Historical Commission and the Director of Construction
of the Division of Construction Management.
