6	WHEREAS, Alabama public pension funds administer			
7	retirement benefits for more than 330,000 current and former			
8	employees of state and local governments; and			
9	WHEREAS, the financial health of Alabama's public			
10	pension funds has deteriorated in recent years due to a			
11	variety of factors, including investment returns, demographic			
12	experience, and cost-of-living adjustments; and			
13	WHEREAS, the current unfunded liability of the			
14	Employees' Retirement System, the Teachers' Retirement System,			
15	and the Judicial Retirement Fund for retirement benefits as of			
16	September 30, 2013, exceeded \$12 billion; and			
17	WHEREAS, improving the long-term financial health of			
18	Alabama's public pensions is a shared goal of current and			
19	former public employees, public employers, and the citizens of			
20	Alabama; and			
21	WHEREAS, the State of Alabama health insurance			
22	programs continue to see rising costs associated with retiree			
23	health insurance benefits; and			
24	WHEREAS, the Legislature believes it is appropriate			

to create a joint committee of the Legislature to evaluate

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1	Alabama public pension funds and to establish a long-term plan
2	toward improving the financial health of the funds; now
3	therefore,

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BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Joint Committee on Alabama Public Pensions is created to study and develop consensus recommendations concerning the benefits, investments, and funding of the state-administered retirement systems and any other measures that the committee believes would lead to the improved financial stability of the state-administered retirement systems. The committee shall also study retiree health insurance benefits to determine any future measures to ensure stability of the state health insurance programs.

The committee shall be composed of the following members:

- (1) Three members of the House Ways and Means
 Education Committee, appointed by the Speaker of the House,
 one of whom must be a member of the minority party.
- (2) Three members of the House Ways and Means
 General Fund Committee, appointed by the Speaker of the House,
 one of whom must be a member of the minority party.
- (3) Three members of the Senate Finance and Taxation General Fund Committee, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, one of whom must be a member of the minority party.

1	(4) Three members of the Senate Finance and Taxation
2	Education Committee, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of
3	the Senate, one of whom must be a member of the minority
4	party.

(5) Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House.

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(6) Two members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

A chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation General Fund Committee, House Ways and Means General Fund Committee, Senate Finance and Taxation Education Committee, or House Ways and Means Education Committee who is not appointed to the committee as provided above, may participate in the meetings of the committee as a non-voting ex officio member.

The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall each appoint a co-chair of the committee from among the members appointed to the committee.

All agencies and departments of the state, including, but not limited to, the Retirement Systems of Alabama, shall provide any assistance and information requested by the committee.

The committee shall have the authority to utilize any and all assistance and research data available from any outside groups, including, but not limited to, the Pew Charitable Trusts.

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The committee shall meet at least monthly prior to
December 15, 2015. The committee shall submit its findings and
recommendations and any proposed legislation to the
Legislature within the first five legislative days of the 2016
Regular Session, at which time the committee is dissolved.

Upon request of the co-chairs, the Secretary of the Senate, the Clerk of the House of Representatives, the Director of the Legislative Reference Service, and the Director of the Legislative Fiscal Office shall provide necessary assistance for the work of the committee.

Each member of the committee shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the commission in accordance with Amendment 871 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901. These payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature.
