ENROLLED, House Joint Resolution,
MOURNING THE DEATH OF DR. MILTON BOOTH PEELER.

WHEREAS, with profound sorrow and regret, we receive news of the death of Dr. Milton Booth Peeler of Huntsville, Alabama, on March 18, 2011, at the age of 84 years; and

WHEREAS, the passing of Dr. Peeler leaves a void in the lives of his loving family, his many friends, and the entire community, where he was well-known and highly regarded; and

WHEREAS, born on March 21, 1926, he was the son of Phillips Woodson Peeler and Marjorie Booth Peeler and graduated from Huntsville High School as valedictorian; and

WHEREAS, after serving with honor and distinction in the United States Army Air Forces during and after World War II, he earned undergraduate and medical degrees from Vanderbilt University; following internship and residency at Vanderbilt, Dr. Peeler returned to Huntsville in 1956 to establish his pediatric practice and later cofounded Huntsville Pediatric Associates, where he practiced until his retirement in 1988; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Peeler served as president of the Madison County Medical Society, the Huntsville Academy of Medicine, and the Tennessee Valley Pediatric Society, as well

1 as chief of staff at Huntsville Hospital; he was involved in
2 polio eradication efforts, early childhood education, and
3 primary care training, among other interests; and

4 WHEREAS, his roles of community leadership included
5 service on a number of boards and commissions, including the
6 Girls' Club; he chaired the administrative board, finance
7 committee, staff-parish relations committee, and board of
8 trustees at First United Methodist Church, where he was a
9 lifetime member; and

10 WHEREAS, in retirement, Dr. Peeler cultivated his
11 interests in gardening, piano, reading, golf, and travel, in
12 addition to delivering Meals on Wheels and spoiling his
13 grandchildren; and

14 WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife of 61 years,
15 Betty Driver Peeler; five children, Patricia (Joel) Marshall,
16 David (Cindy) Peeler, Virginia Peeler, Betty Booth Peeler, and
17 Sarah Tatum; and six grandchildren, Jennifer and Adam
18 Marshall, Blanton Tatum, and Andrew, Emily, and Elise Peeler;

20 WHEREAS, Dr. Peeler was a valued member of the
21 community; he will be sorely missed by family and friends as
22 well as thousands of his former patients, whom he treasured
23 and always treated with gentleness and skill; now therefore,
