7	WHEREAS, it is with highest commendation that we
8	recognize Conservation Enforcement Officer Timothy Joe
9	Lindsey, II, as the recipient of the 2012 Alabama Legislative
10	Medal of Honor for Law Enforcement, Alabama's highest law
11	enforcement award for extraordinary courage in the line of
12	duty; and
13	WHEREAS, Officer Lindsey is a Game Warden in Madison
14	County and an eight-year veteran of the Department of
15	Conservation and Natural Resources; and
16	WHEREAS, in June 2011, Officer Lindsey, while
17	off-duty, placed himself in grave and immediate personal
18	danger when, with total disregard for his own safety, he
19	entered the burning and potentially explosive wreckage of an
20	aircraft and rescued a seven-year-old child, the sole survivor
21	of the crash that Officer Lindsey had just witnessed; the
22	rescued child, although severely injured, survived, very
23	possibly due to Officer Lindsey's quick response; and
24	WHEREAS, Officer Lindsey, whose father is a licensed
25	pilot and airplane owner, had full knowledge of the danger

inherent in entering the burning wreckage saturated with aviation fuel; in addition, Officer Lindsey had his wife and his eight-year-old son with him and could easily have chosen not to become involved, but he chose to risk his life for a stranger; and

WHEREAS, it is representative of Officer Lindsey's 6 character and modesty that, as soon as the situation was 7 8 stabilized, he left the scene without divulging his identity 9 to anyone and received no recognition until television news 10 coverage later; the rescue was similar to an event on Thanksgiving Day 2008, when Officer Lindsey, while off-duty, 11 risked his own life and successfully saved a victim trapped in 12 13 a burning vehicle; and

14 WHEREAS, with his extraordinary and consistent 15 heroism, Officer Lindsey is a worthy exemplar of those caring 16 and dedicated men and women who stand ever ready to provide 17 prompt and professional response in times of crisis, and he is 18 highly deserving of the Legislative Medal of Honor for Law 19 Enforcement; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we hereby recognize and honor Conservation Enforcement Officer Timothy Joe Lindsey, II, of Madison County as the recipient of the 2012 Legislative Medal of Honor for Law Enforcement and direct that he receive a copy of this resolution as evidence of our admiration and esteem.
