8	CONGRATULATING ROMAN HARPER AS THE FIRST PRATTVILLE
9	HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE SUPER BOWL.

11	WHEREAS, we note with great appreciation that, on
12	February 7, 2010, Roman Harper of the New Orleans Saints
13	became the first former Prattville High School athlete to
14	participate in the Super Bowl; and
15	WHEREAS, a native of Prattville, Mr. Harper starred
16	in both basketball and football at Prattville High; he played
17	point guard on the basketball team and both quarterback and
18	free safety in football, but it was at defensive back where
19	his future lay; and
20	WHEREAS, after graduating from Prattville High
21	School, Mr. Harper proceeded to a great career as a member of
22	The University of Alabama Crimson Tide; a four-year
23	contributor and three-year starter, he was selected to the
24	All-Southeastern Conference team as both a junior and senior
25	and often served as a team spokesman at media events; as a
26	senior in 2005, Mr. Harper was a member of one of the most
27	dominating defenses in the history of The University and of

the SEC; over the course of his great career, he recorded 302 total tackles, five interceptions, 3.5 sacks, four fumble recoveries, and five forced fumbles, including the legendary "Rocky Stop," which became the game-winning play in The University's victory over the Tennessee Volunteers; he holds a B.S. degree in management from The University and remains an avid Crimson Tide fan; Mr. Harper is well-known in his community for wearing his love for The University on his sleeve; and

WHEREAS, drafted in the second round of the NFL draft by the New Orleans Saints, Mr. Harper immediately earned a starting job as a strong safety with the team; as a rookie in 2006, he started five games before suffering a season-ending injury; he recovered and returned to starting in 2007; over the course of his four-year career, Mr. Harper has started every game for which he has been active and, in 2007, was awarded the Ed Block Courage Award by his teammates; in those four years, he has recorded 319 tackles, 6.5 sacks, three interceptions, 21 pass defenses, and six forced fumbles; he is particularly recognized for his ability to rush the passer, consistently ranking among the league leaders for sacks by a defensive back; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Harper led the Saints with eight tackles in their 31-17 victory over the heavily favored Indianapolis Colts; and

WHEREAS, born December 2, 1982, the third of four children to Ronald T. and Princess L. Harper, he is a member

1 of an exceptionally close-knit family; he and his brother, 2 Ronnie, both chose to wear their father's jersey number - 41 while playing football in college; Mr. Harper currently wears 3 4 that same number with the Saints; he, his family, the people of Prattville, and the people of the State of Alabama are 5 6 justly proud of our native son's continued pursuit of 7 excellence on the field and in the community; now therefore, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 8 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we heartily congratulate Roman 9 10 Harper as the first former Prattville High School athlete to 11 participate in the Super Bowl and that, by copy of this 12 resolution, we hereby extend our heartfelt good wishes for all 13 his future endeavors.
